SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are report by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during grou air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specifi information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Offic and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses. both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, for the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QLGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Enlisted Personnel Presumed Dead.

1. The following named enlisted personnel of the 359th Infantry Regiment were initially reported as casualties on 6 June 1944, in France, not on flying or jump status, by Casualty Shipment No. 096 ETO, and their status was subsequently changed to missing in action on the same date. They were presumed dead as of 7 June 1945, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act:

Pfc James T. Hoke 38094200
Pfc William L. Langston 18086596
Pfc Raymond C. Sanders 37107418

- 2. On 29 March 1945, a communication, AGPC-S 704 (29 Mar 45) was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations requesting that circumstances forming the basis of change of status in the cases of Hoke and Langston be submitted to this office. The Fourth Indorsement added to the basic communication on 11 March 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment shows that both of these soldiers were reported slightly wounded in action on 6 June 1944 by their respective companies and that no further information had been received concerning their status with the exception of status cards received from the Third United States Army changing their status to missing in action as of 6 June 1944. The Lighth Indorsement, dated 16 April 1945, also added to Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, reads, in part, as follows:
 - "1. Pfc. James T. Hoke, 38094200, Company 'M', 359th Infantry was reported LWA 6 June 1944 to us by Captain James K. Kellond, no longer a member of this organization.
 - "2. Pfc. William L. Langston, 18086596, Company 'A', 359th Infantry was reported LWA 6 June 1944 to us by Captain Robert C. Couch, Jr., no longer a member of this organization.
 - "3. First and Third Battalions were attached to 4th Infantry Division on D-Day the 6th of June 1944. Pfc. Hoke, Pfc Langston being a member of 'A' Company was in First Rattalion. Company 'A' arrived at 061815 and Company 'A' arrived at 062330. Both Battalions landed on Utah Red Peach (east coast of Cherbourg Peninsula).

Admission and Disposition Sheets were prepared by the 4th Infantry Division, but due to the battle conditions on D-Day much of the casualty information was not on Admission and Disposition Reports, but rather on certificates from companies concerned. Reports were made accordingly by this Headquarters when any such casualty information reached us if source could be considered reliable and insure accuracy. "5. Further information consists of the following: "a. LWA status on each of the two men was reported to us on certificates signed by Officers mentioned in paragraphs 1 & 2 above. The casualties occurred in the beach area. "b. it is not known by us whether either of the two men arrived at the aid station. However, they were left behind to be taken care of by medics coming in from the rear. "c. Tactical situation was one of heavy, but scattered opposition. There was much artillery and motor fire. Enemy snipers were active throughout the area, a large part of which was flooded swamp. There was occasional straffing and bombing. Areas were covered with mines. Our troops were mopping up as they went along and making a reconnaissance in force as a reserve to the 4th Infantry Division. There was a possibility of capture by enemy patrols or the subject enlisted men could have been hit again by the artillery and motor fire while awaiting further aid. We have no evidence, of course, of either of these possibilities, but it is known that in at least one similar case on LWA later was found buried on the beach." 3. A communication, AGPC-S 201 Sanders, Raymond C. (19 Apr 45), was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations on 19 April 1945, for additional information concerning the disappearance of Frivate First Class Sanders. A request for disposition made for this soldier's Service Record was also included in the communication. The communication was returned to this office from Headquarters, ETOUSA by Seventh Indorsement, dated 24 May 1945, which shows that soldier's Service Record was forwarded to The Adjutant General's Office on 5 March 1945. The Fourth Indorsement which had been added to the basic communication under date of 5 May 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, indicates that Sanders was reported seriously wounded in action on 6 June 1944 by First Lieutenant -2August D. Parker, who was killed in action on 9 June 1944. Other information contained in the indorsement is substantially the same as that set forth in the preceding subparagraph concerning the disappearance of Privates Hoke and Langston.

- 4. An examination of the index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PMGO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review. The Captured German Records, now of record in this office, does not reveal the names of subject enlisted men. The Quartermaster General's Office, Memorial Division (Mrs. McConaughy) reports there are no burial reports of record in that office, nor are there any favorable Unknowns to be associated with this case.
- 5. In the absence of any definite information as to the fate of subject enlisted men after they were wounded in action, it is concluded that the information of record in the Department, as this time, does not warrant the issuance of official reports of death under the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Casualty Branch.

SUBJECT: Review and Determination of Status Under the Missing Persons Act.

I. - FACTS

1. The following-named persons of the organizations indicated have been carried on War Department records as missing in action, in France, since 6 June 1944, as reported by the ETO Shipment numbers shown opposite their names:

- 16. The three members of the 359th Infantry Regiment named in paragraph 1p, above, were initially reported as casualties on 6 June 1944 in the status of slightly or seriously wounded in action by ETO Shipment number 096 and their status was subsequently changed to missing in action.
- a. On 29 March 1945, a confidential communication, AGPC-S 704 (29 Mar 45) was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations requesting that circumstances forming the basis for change of status in the cases of Moke and Langston be submitted to this office. The Fourth Indorsement added to the basic communication on 11 March 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment states that both of these soldiers were reported slightly wounded in action on 6 June 1944 by their respective companies and that no further information had been received concerning their status with the exception of status cards received from the Third United States Army changing their status to missing in action as of 6 June 1944. The Eighth Indorsement, dated 16 April 1945, also added at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, reads, in part, as follows:
 - "1. Pfc James T. Hoke, 38094200, Company
 "M", 359th Infantry was reported LWA 6 June 1944
 to us by Camptain James K. Kellond, no longer a
 member of this organization.

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- "2. Pfc. William L. Langston, 18086596, Company 'A', 359th Infantry was reported LWA 6 June 1944 to us by Captain Robert C. Couch, Jr., no longer a member of this organization.
- "3. First and Third Battalions were attached to 4th Infantry Division on D-Day the 6th of June 1944. Pfc. Hoke, being a member of 'M' Company was in Third Battalion and Pfc. Langston being a member of 'A' Company was in First Battalion. Company 'Al arrived at 061815 and Company 'M' arrived at 062330. Both Battalions landed on Utah Red Beach (east coast of Cherbourg Peninsula).
- "4. Admission and Disposition Sheets were prepared by the 4th Infantry Division, but due to the battale conditions on D-Day much of the casualty information was not on Admission and Disposition Reports, but rather on certificates from companies concerned. Reports were made accordingly by this Headquarters when any such casualty information reached us if source could be considered reliable and insure accuracy.
- "5. Further information consists of the following:
- "a. LWA status on each of the two men was reported to us on certificates signed by Officers Mentioned in paragraphs 1& 2 above. The casualties occurred in the beach area.
- "b. It is not known by us whether either of the two men arrived at the aid station. However, they were left behind to be taken care of by Medics coming in from the rear.
- "c. Tactical situation was on of heavy, but scattered opposition. There was much artillery and mortar fire. Enemy snipers were active throughout the area, a large part of which was flooded swamp. There was occasional straffing and bombing. Areas were covered with mines. Our troops were mopping up as they went along and making reconnaissance in force as a reserve to the 4th Infantry Division. There was a possibility of capture by enemy patrols or the subject enlisted men could have been hit again by the artillery and mortar fire while awaiting further aid. We have no evidence, of course, of

either of these possibilities, but it is known that in al least one similar case an LWA later was found buried on the beach."

b. A confidential communication, AGPC-S 201 Sanders, Raymond C. (19 Apr 45), was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations on 19 April 1945, for additional information concerning the disappearance of Primate First Class Sanders. A request for disposition made of this soldier's Service Record was also included in the communication. The communication has been returned to this office from Headquarters, ETOUSA, by Seventh Indorsement, dated 24 May 1945. which states that soldier's Scrvice Record was forwarded to The Adjutant General's Officer on 5 Merch 1945. However, to date it has not been received in this office and it is not on file in the Enlisted Branch, AGO. The Fourth Indorsement which had been added to the basic communication under date of 5 May 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, indicates that Sanders was reported seriously wounded in action on 6 June by First Lieutenant August D. Parker, who was killed in action on 9 June 1944. Other information contained in the indorsement is substantially the same as that set forth in the preceding subparagraph concerning the disappearance of Privates First Class Hoke and Langston.

II. - CONCLUSIONS

- l. The persons whose status is herein under condideration became missing in action 6 June 1944, while participating in the initial assault on the northern coast of France, which marked the beginning of the invasion of Western Europe by Allied forces. Major landings were effected on the beaches east of the Cherbourg Peninsula (Omaha Beach) with secondary landings being made on the east coast of the peninsula itself (Utah Beach). Intense enemy opposition was encountered both during the landings and after beachheads had been established. Many of the subject personnel were last observed in landing boats and other craft approaching the beach under heavy enemy fire. Some of the craft were hit and observed to sink or capsize causing numerous casualties. Other personnel were last seen on the beaches, which were being subjected to enemy artillery, mortar and machine-gun fire and occasional straffing and bombing by enemy planes.
- 2. A period of twelve months has elapsed since the day the invasion of France began. An examination of all pertinent records and reports available to the War Department fails to indicate that any of the subject personnel have been seen or heard from by anyone since that date except in the case of First Sergeant Sandy Martin, Jr. Martin was last seen alive on the day following the initial assault, although he had been seriously wounded. He was a number of other subject personnel were initially reported as casualties in a "wounded" or "injured" status and such status was subsequently changed to missing in action,

based on canvasses of hospitals and other installations and examination of records which failed to reveal that they had been hospitalized or evacuated subsequent to the time they were wounded.

3. In view of the non-receipt of any report that would provide adequate basis for presuming that one or more of the subject personnel may still be living and due to the intense overall battle conditions under which these persons disappeared, it is concluded that they may not "reasonably be presumed to be living" within the meaning of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act.

III. - RECOMMENDATION


It is recommended that findings of death be made under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act in the cases of the forty-two persons named in paragraph 1, Part I, of this review, and that these findings show the presumed date of death, in each case, to be 7 June 1945.

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Enlisted Personnel Presumed Dead.

1. The following named enlisted personnel of the 359th Infantry Regiment were initially reported as casualties on 6 June 1944, in France, not on flying or jumpt status, by Casualty Shipment No. 096 ETO, and their status was subsequently changed to missing in action on the same date. They were presumed dead as of 7 June 1945, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act:

- 2. On 29 March 1945, a communication, AGPC-S 704 (29 Mar 45) was dispatched to the European Theater of Operations requesting that circumstances forming the basis of change of status in the cases of Hoke and Langston be submitted to this office. The Fourth Indorsement added to the basic communication on 11 March 1945 at Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment shows that both of these soldiers were reported slightly wounded in action on 6 June 1944 by the respective companies and that no further information had been received concerning their status with the exception of status cards received from the Third United States Army changing their status to missing in action as of 6 June 1944. The Eighth Indorsement, dated 16 April 1945, also added to Headquarters, 359th Infantry Regiment, reads, in part, as follows:
 - "1. Pfc. James T. Hoke, 38094200, Company 'M', 359th Infantry was reported LWA 6 June 1944 to us by Captain James K. Kellond, no longer a member of this organization.

An examination of the index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, FMGO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review. The Captured German Records, now of record in this office, does not reveal the names of subject enlisted men. The Quartermaster General's Office, Memorial Division (Mrs. McConaughy) reports there are no burial reports of record in that office, nor are there any favorable Unknowns to be associated with this case. 5. In the absence of any definite information as to the fate of subject enlisted men after they were wounded in action, it is concluded that the information of record in the Department, as this time, does not warrant the issuance of official reports of death under the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act. 359TH INFANTRY REGIMENT After action Report 5 June 1944 1st Bn andRegtl Ho Co joined convoy at 1800. 3d Bn at 1330 went back to Dartmouth Bay for supplies and at 1715 they joined the convoy. Group B proceeded East along the Channel. During the night Group AA joined a convoy to cross the Channel. 6 June 1944 D-Day Group AA beached at 1000. Group A LCI's off Utah Beach. 1st and 3d Bn beached at 1600 and moved to Bn assembly area then to bivouac area arriving at 2045. Liberty Ships carrying the remainder of 2nd Bn and attachments, moved across Channel during the night. 8 June 1944 1st Bn moved to Bandienville closing at 0700. At 1145 patrol sent to Azeville. At 1500 Co B atche to CT 12. Received heavy casualties. 3d Bn moved to Bandienville closing at 0700. 

Sanders, 37,107,418, Infantry, was reported missing in action 6 June 1944, the War Department has entertained the hope that he survived and that information would be rerealed dispelling the uncertainty surrounding his absence. However, as in many cases, the conditions of warfare deny us such information. The record concerning your son shows that he was wounded while participating in the invasion of northern France, but that he was not seen or heard from thereafter. Full consideration has recently been given to all available information bearing on the absence of your son, including all records, reports and circumstances. These have been carefully reviewed and considered. In view of the fact that twelve months have now expired without the receipt of evidence of support a continued presumption of survival, the War Department must terminate such absence by a presumptive finding of death. Accordingly, an official finding of death has been recorded under the provisions of Bublic Law 490, 77th Congress, approved March 7, 1942, as amended. The finding does not establish an actual or probable date of death; however, as required by law it includes a presumptive date of death for the termination of pay and allowances, settelement of accounts and payment of death gratuities. In the case of your son this date has been set as 7 June 1945, the day following the expiration of twelve months' absence. I regret the necessity for this message but trust that the ending of a long period of uncertainty may give at least some small measure of consolation. I hope that you may find sustaining comfort in the thought that the uncertainty with which war has surrounded the absence of your son has enhanced the honor of his service to his country and of his sacrifice. Dear Mrs. Sanders:

I am replying further to your recent letter, requesting information concerning your son, the late Private First Class Raymond C. Sanders.

I realize your desire for further details regarding the status of your son. The information available in this office discloses that on 6 June 1944, Private Sanders was serving with the 359th Infantry Regiment in the initial assault on the northern coast of France, which made the beginning of the invasion of Western Europe by Allied forces. Your son's organization landed on the east coast of the Cherbourg Peninsula. Intense enemy opposition was encountered both during the landings and agter beachheads had been established. Some of the craft were hit and observed to sink or capsize, causing numerous casualties. Other personnel were last seen on the beaches, which were being subjected to enemy artillery, mortar, and machinegun fire, as well as occasional strafing and bombing by enemy planes. These extraordinary battle conditions caused a disruption of normal administrative functions of our forces.

An officer reported that your son had been seriously wounded. Reports reaching this office did not indicate the nature and extent of his wounds or contain details as to the attending circumstances. When no further word was received regarding Private Sanders and a careful check in the overseas theater failed to disclose his whereabouts, the War Department records were amended to show him as missing action. Subsequently, all reports and records concerning his disappearance were reviewed, pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended, and it was concluded, after careful consideration, that there was no basis to support a presumption that he is alive. Accordingly, the finding of death was issued. In considering any case under the cited law the War Department does not deem it sound policy to make a finding of death while any reasonable ground remains for a presumption that the person in question may still be alive. AGPC-G 201 Sanders, Raymond C. (9 Nov 45)

In connection with your belief that Private Sanders might be a victim of amnesia, permit me to explain that in all cases where a soldier's condition is such that he is unable to make his identity properly known, various means are used to establish conclusively his identify. These means include the comparison of the fingerprints and dental charts of the individual incolved with those file in Washington, D.C. After identity is positively established, the responsible authority, who is notified as to the person's name and Army serial number, submits a report to the War Department for subsequent notification to the family concerned.

Our overseas commanders are continuing efforts to obtain definite information regarding our men who were reported missing in action and in whose cases death findings were subsequently made. You may be certain that in the event a further report pertaining to your son is received, you will be advised promptly.

My deepest sympathy is with you in your sorrow.


