The admission station is listed as European Theater Norway, France, Germany, Holland, Denmark, Belgium, Russia---

ANS: Does not mean he served in these countries but rather is a description of mostly the entire European Theater of Operation.

Reference the Non-Effective Days listed in the second report:

ANS: We interpret that to be the days he was hospitalized a total 147 days.

What does the term disposition date above the Non-Effective Days section refer to:

ANS: In the case of the second admissions card, we interpret that as the date released from hospital and back to duty status
