Louisville Veteran of Invasions Killed In Battle for France

Pfc. Ferdinand Gnau, 27, son of Mrs. Sarah Gnau, 508 Fehr Avenue, who previously was reported missing June 9, was killed in France June 11, the War Department announced yesterday.

After seeing action in North Africa, Sicily and Italy, he was sent to England to prepare for the invasion.

With an airborne division, he was awarded two stars on h is European theater ribbon for the Tunisian and Italian campaigns. In-

ducted by the Army December, 1942, and overseas since April, 1943, he attended Theodore Ahrens Trade High School and was a former employe of the Jeffersonville Boat & Machine Company.

Pfc. William T. Stillwell, 38, son of Mrs. Feby L. Rayburn, Okolona, was killed in France July 4. Inducted more than a year ago and overseas three months with the infantry, he formerly was employed with the Louisville Pottery Company for eighteen years. Surviving him are two brothers, Edward Stillwell, an overseas veteran of World War I, and two sisters, Mrs. Pearl Hodge, Louisville, and Mrs. Betty Fleener, Coral Ridge.

Pfc. William P. Robertson, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Robertson, 3614 W. Kentucky, died in France June 22. Overseas since last May, he was a student at du Pont Manual Training High School before he entered the service in August, 1943. He is survived by four brothers, Earl Robertson, Jr., in New Guinea for fourteen months, Eugene F. Robertson, Gerald S. Robertson, and John F. Robertson, and a sister, Miss Shirley Ann Robertson.
