



REPORT ON THIRD BATTALION NEPTURE.

Upon reporting to regimental Headquarters in Carentan, orders were received to attack along the Enupte road at 0500, D plus 7, following artillery barrage commencing at 0430. As the location of the 1st Battalion was undefinate and guides not available, plans were made to attack with G-H-I-Co's echeloned to left rear with G Co. guiding on the Baupte road. The 2nd Battalion 506 was to attack on our right and the 501 on our left. Following a spotty barrage, the attack opened at 0500 as ordered. At this time there was no contact with any of the flank units or unit to be relieved. There was no communication within the Battalion.

relief made, and the attack pushed. Enemy contact was immediately made and they withdrew slightly past Douville. As the attack progressed the Battalien found itself ahead of the End Battalion and receiving fire in its rear from them. I Co. reported contact with the 50Ist on our left and found we were ahead of them also. The fire from front and flanks became very heavy and the attack malted. Help was asked for and a platoen of light tanks arrived. The tanks misjudged the front line and fired on our own men, killing at least two and wounding five. This plus the failure of either the 50Ist or 2nd Battalion 506 to advance forced our Battalion to withdraw to our original line of depature where the line was straightened and defence set up.

In the afternoon our Eattalion was relieved by the 401st Glider Eattalion plus a Battalion of the 2nd Armored Division with infantry attachments. The Eattalion moved to a bivouac area in Carentan at the Easin a Flot.
