## RECORD OF EVENTS

### HEADQUARTERS COMPANY 1ST BN

- 11 Jun 44: No change.
- 12 Jun 44: Remained in defensive position, little activity. Much air activity over German held strong points.
- 13 Jun 44: Was relieved of defensive position 0800 13 Jun 44. Moved by truck 5 miles north of Ste Mere Eglise to bivouac area. Care & cleaning remainder of day.
- 14 Jun 44: Still in rest area, received barracks bags, put on one hour alert. Care and cleaning of equipment.
- 15 Jun 44: Made attack on town of Bonneville. Mission successful.
- 16 Jun 44: Continued the attack. Captured Ste Sauveur Le Vicomte. Moved on to outskirts of town.
- 17 Jun 44: Remained in defensive position entire day. Most of us shaved and cleaned up.
- 18 Jun 44: Remaining in rest area. Care and cleaning and resupply. Heavy artillery bombardment late that evening. Several casualties.
- 19 Jun 44: Moved from rest area to forward position.
- 20 Jun 44: Remained in rest area. Collected foreign weapons.
- 21 Jun 44: Remaining in rest area. No activity. Bn CO gave us some hot "Poop."
- 22 Jun 44: Moved from rest area to position 3 mi west of Las Molpiersnen. Waiting to attack.
- 23 Jun 44: Remaining in position waiting to attack.
- 24 Jun 44: Still in defense position, only patrol activity.
- 25 Jun 44: Still in defense position, patrol activity only.

AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular No. 32, Headquarters ETOUSA, 20 March 1944, and Circular No. 66, Headquarters First United States Army, 18 May 1944, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following named individuals for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 6 June 1944 in NORMANDY, FRANCE. Shortly after 0100 on D-Day these men dropped by parachute as members of small Pathfinder Teams with equipment and apparatus for guiding the incoming parachute and glider lifts to designated drop and landing zones. They were the advance elements of a mighty armada of airborne elements. They had no protection save their individual arms. The very nature of their mission denied them the privilege of seeking cover and concealment after landing. The operation of their apparatus and the marking lights on the fields they occupied revealed their exact location to the enemy. They exhibited superb courage, cool-headed efficiency and daring of the highest order. They accomplished their hazardous missions with remarkable efficiency. Many of them made the supreme sacrifice, many of them were wounded, but all did their duty and contributed materially to the success of the greatest night airborne operation ever attempted by any army. Their voluntary performance of this especially hazardous duty was a superb demonstration of the qualities which will bring Victory ever closer.
