## RECORD OF EVENTS

10 Jan 45-Co started to attack on a 55' Azimuth to take high ground East of Noville Belgium, at 0930. Suffered casualties from enemy 75mm field piece and 88's-Co withdrew to original take off position which was our MLR-No great number of enemy encountered during main attack.

11 Jan 45-Co checked communications lines and 536 Radio's turned in 3 for repair only one 536 remains in Co at present. Sent out patrols to contact Co I 3rd Bn same Regt - 500yds NE by E from our present location. Also sent out patrols to keep contact with unit on our right flank - Shelling cont. as usual.

12 Jan 45-Co moved from line of departure from an attack to gain high ground 55' Azimuth from 61d pce at 1400 - 3rd Bn

fire also. Advanced Approx. 700 yds  
Established MIA & CP. Tied in with  
units on both left and right flanks  
at 1830. Men remaining in new dug in  
positions without blankets.

13 Jan 45-Co dug in during night and out-  
posted Area to our front at 0900 -  
Enemy attempted attack through Co front  
-fire fight followed lasting through  
two hours. At 1100 one unit of 327 gli  
Inf pushed through our lines driving  
enemy back - heavy shelling and mortar  
fire persisted all day. At 1800 Co drew  
back into Div reserve former MIA of two  
days ago.

14 Jan - Co in Div Reserve-For thirds of  
men were able to take showers in Bast.  
Belgium. Shelling of Co area continued  
to some extent but no casualties as men  
well dug in.
