RECORD OF EVENTS

JUNE 6 44: About 2 miles East of Ste. Mere Eglise, France - Btry left Eovcuac Area in trucks & loaded in Gliders on Membury Field, England, preparatory to leaving on mission. At 2037 Btry took off fr field and flew by glider to France & landed behind enemy lines. Weather: Fair; Morale: Good. Distance covered: About 150 miles.

JUNE 7 44: About 2 mi East Ste Mere Eglise, France - Btry spent day in salvaging equipment & evacuating casualties. An all around defense was set up in area & balance of day was spent in much needed rest. Weather: Fair; Morale: Good.

JUNE 8 44: At 1100 remainder of glider loads assembled at Div CP where personnel & equipment were reorganized and Bn was reformed into one eight howitzer firing btry. Moved into position 1 mi SW Ste Mere Eglise, France. Remained in position, firing several concentrations. Morale: Good; Weather: Inclement; Distance Travelled: 1 Mile.

JUNE 9 44: About 1 mi SW Ste Mere Eglise, France - The one 8 gun btry was split into two 4 gun btrys. Btry fired several concentrations supporting infantry. There was no shelling by the enemy on Btry position. Morale: Good; Weather: Cloudy Cool & Light Rains; Distance Travelled: None

JUNE 10, 44: Btry still in same position. Fired only a few rounds. No enemy arty or small arm fire. About 23/5 enemy planes became active & dropped bombs in general area of Ste Mere Eglise. Morale: Good; Weather: Inclement.
