June 6/44: Forward Eccelon: elford lark irfield Berksmire, England, Eatter: left dirfield on take off at 2040 comprising of 6 Horsa Gliders, 2 Gliders with 2 Officer and 27 El' forced down near take-off field. England Landed in and near Ste. Lere Eslise France at 2315 hrs. all Cliders made crash landings with great damage and heavy casualties near enemy troops and incediately under Artillery, ortar and small arm fire, l'en were scattered end spent night under fire with 505th Front Inf Regt. Battery was assembled as soon as nossible. A EM Killed in Action, 1 Cff and 7 EM Lightly Injured in Action, 1 H! Seriously Injured in action, and 1 El Seriousl Counded in Action, all hospitalized. 7 June 1944: Battalion was organized at coordinates 33.7 - 96.2 Map Sheet 31/18 NF 1/-25000, and firing was started immediately with two guns and armunition that could be accuired Clearing the equipment from wrecked gliders was done under artillery and small arms fire. Hen were still coming in from various mains units and digging in quickly, subject to 88% fire at all times. Two gliders with 3 Officers and 27 E' landed at LZ and were shelled by -the enemy, all personnel were safe and saved most of their equipment. 4 FN Lightly 'ounded in Action during the day and hospitalized.

Died of Injuries and 1 EM previously Lightly Injured in Action returned to duty.

8 June 1944: Fosition was improved and Enfired continually throughout the day and night Shelling of our area by the enemy lasted until noon and small arms fire came t rough
