- 3. The \$75 maximum allowance by the government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.
- 4. Reimbursement by the government is made only to the person who paid from his personal funds the expenses of or incident to interment in a private or civilian cemetery. Receipted bills are not required to accompany this form. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.

Acknowledgment is made of your letter of recent date, relative to the burial and return of the remains of your son, the late Private First Class Stephen Via, Jr.

6 January 1945

The official report of interment received in this office shows that the remains of your son were reverently and properly interred in the U.S. Military Cemetery, St. Mere Eglise #1, St. Mere Eglise, France, Grave 183, Row 10, Plot B, with an appropriate ceremony conducted at the grave by an Army Chaplain. A temporary marker has been erected with a fitting inscription thereon. The cemetery is under immediate supervision of our military authorities.

At the outbreak of the war it became necessary to adopt the policy that the remains of military personnel who die at stations outside the United States shall be interred locally until the end of the war, at which time the remains will be prepared and shipped at Government expense to the place thus designated.

A notation has been made on the official records of this office that it is your desire to have the remains of your son returned, if possible, for final interment after the war. At the proper time, the legal next of kin will be contacted by this office in order to obtain the latest shipping instructions and action will be taken at that time to carry out your request.

You may be assured that when the remains of your son are returned, if possible, there will be no mistake as to his identity, as the graves are properly marked and recorded for future identification.




