RECORD OF EVENTS

9 June 44 company left assembly area at 1030
crossed bridge and causeway over Harderik
River at 1045. Under heavy mortar and auto-
matic fire. Casualties heavy. Took high
ground west of town. Moved forward in attack
500 yds at 2000. 16 June 44 launched attack
at 1000 to secure line of departure for
drive toward St. Sauveur. Subjected to heavy
mortar fire. Heavy resistance better at each
hedge-row. Secured line at 1600.
