the defenses around Neuhof were probably unmanned and that it was believed the few defenders would surrender without a fight.

Moving back to his 3rd Platoon of Company C, Teras briefed his men on what he thought would be a cake-walk. Moving to the edge of the woods overlooking snow-covered fields, the platoon dispersed into a skirmish line. At 1630 just before dark, they started out into the open. The German defenders, well protected in heavy concrete bunkers, waited patiently until the platoon was fully committed. Then they opened fire with their automatic weapons and mortars. The platoon was decimated almost immediately.

Col. Gerard, watching the attack from the shelter of his forward CP, sent word by radio for the platoon to fall back. He had his answer; the defenders of Neuhof-Udenbreth were alert and organized. The Siegfried Line would be a tough obstacle to crack.

Lt. Teras and his platoon crawled under the bushes and snow drifts to await darkness. Pvt. Billie Morrison, who had enjoyed the hospitality of Dr. Degueldre in Pepinster, was seriously wounded and would die of wounds four days later. Pfc Clem Puetzer would send a Flexible Flyer sled to his "family" in Pepinster, but would spend the rest of his life in a wheelchair. Teras, wounded in the leg, would return to the 325 within four weeks.

The attack on Neuhof-Udenbreth jumped off at 0430 2 February in darkness. The 1st Battalion on the right attacked toward Neuhof with Companies A and B abreast. Supporting tanks moved directly down the road leading into Neuhof. Moving rapidly in the darkness, the riflemen of Companies A and B reached the dragon's teeth (concrete anti-tank obstacles) and were facing the prepared concrete bunkers before daylight.

Gerard called for the tanks to move up with the infantry. Pierce, having been relieved that night by Richardson (returning from his hospital stay) went out to get the tanks moving. Going to the lead tank in the darkness, Pierce had to seek shelter as streams of tracers came soaring up from the bunkers. Hammering on the tank with his helmet he got the attention of the tank commander. When advised that the infantry needed the tanks to move up, the tank commander replied that he could not do it; the tanks had to be refueled!

The 3rd Battalion also moved out in darkness, attacking on the left of the 1st Battalion with the objective of taking Udenbreth. With prodding from Col. Billingslea, the tanks supporting this battalion moved up to the dragon's teeth.

To the men in the lead companies, it seemed they were shot up for hours. As Company A closed in on the dragon's teeth, they were raked from behind with machine gun fire from their supporting tanks. Jack Smith looked back and saw the arc of the tracers coming toward him. Millsaps on his left was hit, Baker on his right was hit, and Bernard Veberg behind him was hit.

Lt. Bill Williams, a tall lanky Texan, stood upright to lead the attack. The men got up as one and charged into the town. They were angry and indifferent to dying. Smith plopped down to catch his breath, sitting with his back against a post. John Moszer sat down with his head and back against the opposite side of the post. They turned to look back at the dragon's teeth and watched a mortar shell explode and blacken the snow a little distance from them. A chunk of steel from the shell embedded itself in the post between their heads and neither of them bothered to move!

As they attacked toward Udenbreth, Company I (E-401) came under machine gun fire from the concrete bunkers the minute they came out of the woods. As they moved through the
