65. John F. Whitlock Cpl. 36312821 Co. C. 502nd Pchbt Inf.

Cpl Whitlock was killed during the battle for Caumont France on the 11th of June 1944. Cpl. Whitlock is buried at the 8th Corps Cemetery near Les Forges, France.

66. Anthony E. Marcozzi ^{Correct} Pfc. 32076616 Co. C. 502nd Pchbt Inf.

Pfc. Marcozzi, was killed on the 11th of June 1944 as his Battalion was in attack on the strong point of Caumont France Occupied by the Germans. Pfc. Marcozzi is buried at 7th Corps Cemetery near St. Mes Cyglise France.

67. William A. Cooper, Pfc. 15090124 Co. C. 502nd Pchbt Inf.

Pvt. Cooper was killed at Caumont France 11, June 1944 while his Company was attacking Enemy Machine Gun positions. Pvt. Cooper is buried in the 8th Corps Cemetery near Les Forges, France.

68. John L. Davis Pfc. 13069496 Co. C. 502nd Pchbt Inf.

Pvt. Davis was killed at Caumont France while his Company was attacking enemy Gun Emplacement 11, June 1944. Pvt. Davis is buried at 7th Corps Cemetery near St. Mes Cyglise France.

69. Harry T. Dandert, Pfc. 32202661 Co. C. 502nd Pchbt Inf.

Pfc. Dandert was killed at Caumont France, 11, June 1944. Pfc. Dandert is buried at the 7th Corps Cemetery near St. Mes Cyglise France.

Maj. Vaughan was killed by a German soldier after
he had captured a German Supply Train near St. Martin
France on D-Day. Maj. Vaughan was buried at the
Division 101st H.B. Cemetery at Hiesville, France 38792
on the 9, June 1944, 0900hrs.

2. Le Roy Bone - O-390732 1st Lt. Demo. Hq Co. 502nd
Parachute Infantry.

Lt. Bone was killed by a German Soldier near St. Martin
de Varreville, France after stalking him up a hedge row,
on D-Day. Lt. Bone was buried at the Division Cemetery
101st H.B. at Hiesville, France 9, June 1944.

3. Lloyd Evers - O-1293739 2nd Lt. Demo. Hq. Co. 502nd
Parachute Infantry.

Lt. Evers was wounded at St. Martin de Varreville on
D-Day by a German Soldier. Lt. Evers was later killed
while being evacuated to the U.K. for treatment of his
wounds. Lt. Evers was buried by the United States
Navy.

4. Edwin H. Hoover - 35251146 S/Sgt. M/C. Hq. Co 502nd
Parachute Infantry.

Sgt. Hoover was killed by German Soldiers after being taken
prisoner at St. Germain de Varreville, France on D-Day. Sgt
Hoover was buried at 4th Division Cemetery near St.
Martin, France.
