

SUBJECT: Location of Soldier's Grave.

TO : G-I, Headquarters 101st Airborne Division.

l. Letter received from Mrs. William C. Brown stating that communication from the Quartermaster General in Washington revealed that as late as 10 April 1945 no graves location was available for T/4 William C. Brown, 35333922, Hq. and Hq. and Service Battery, 377th Prehet. F. A. Bn. KIA in France 12 June 1944.

2. According to records of 377th Bn. T/4 Brown was buried by the Germans in a hospital yard at Valognes, Normandie and same was registered by the Germans.

3. It is not known if this information has ever reached the Commanding General, Communications Zone, ETOUSA, APO 887, "Attention: AG Casualty Division".


