#### STATEMENT ON WISSING AIRCRAFT NO 43-30734

I, S/Sgt Charles F. Word, ASN 14 079 003 was jumpmaster of plane number 43-3073h on the night of o June 194h. On approach to the drop zone the plane was hit by anti aircraft fire and I was ordered by the crew chief to jump. The crew Chief was in cotact with the pilot by phone, when he gave the order to jump, I yelled "lets go" and jumped.

To the best of my knowledge crew chief did not have on a prachute and as far as I know none of the crew got out of the plane. I landed near Picouville, France.

I, Arthur E. Morin, ASN 31 311 305 was a passenger in plane number 43-30734 the night of 6 June 1944. I was jumping number fifteen in a seventeen man stick.

The plane was hit twice by anti-aircraft fire, the first time in the rear radio compartment and resulted in two casualties of parachute echelon. The ship was on fire as a result of first hit as well as the two men near radio compartment door.

The second hit was near tail of plane and on baggage compartment door. Right after the first hit on plane the jumpmaster, S/Sgt Word, hollered, "Let's go" and I bailed out landing near Picouville, France. In order to get out it was necessary for me to climb up towards the door over other members of stick who were laying on floor of plane and dive out the door.

The crew chief did not have a chute on and to the best of my knowledge none of crew members got out of the plane.

Immediately after I landed the plane crashed in flames approximately 250 yards from me and exploded.

#### REPORT OF CO-FILOT ON C-47A', No. 43-30720.

We were flying on the right wing of the third flight of the second wave. Captain Schaefers was flying lead ship of the third flight of the second we've. We crossed landfell at approximately 1800 feet. Captain Schaefer's ship was slright at that time.

At C118 sergave the paratroopers warning that we were approaching the DZ. At 0119 I saw the left wing of Captain Schaefer's ship burst into flames. He continued to fly on source losing approximately 300 feet, it seemed that he was flying with the automatic pilot.

As his stick of paratroopers had been standing for one minute it is possible that they did jump. I did not see anyone jump as the flames were so bright.

I did not see the plane crash.

When we were in a few minutes of our DZ Captain Schaefer's left wing burst into flemes. I'm not sure whether the underneath of the ship was on fire or not.

We were flying about 1800 feet at 140 mph. My Co-Pilot gave me the time of Oll9 that Captain Schaefer's plane caught fire, he continued on course then peeled off and went down under me. I did not see him crash.

It is possible that his paratroopers had time to jump.




I did not see anyone leave the ship as the door was on the side opposite me.
