LT. G. W. CARL KILLED IN FRANCE; VETERAN OF AFRICA AND SICILY

Lt. Glenn W. Carl, 25, a veteran of the campaigns in North Africa

and Sicily, was killed in action in France on July 16, according to information received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank W. Carl, 510 Webford av., Des Plaines.

His mother said he was the leader of the first platoon entering

Bizerte, North Africa, winning his first lieutenantcy afterward. His company was also among the first to enter Sicily. Later, the officer was transferred to England where he trained with the 9th division and assumed command of one of the first outfits to land in France.

Lt. Carl was born and reared in West Chicago. He was assistant manager of Confidential Loan Service, Inc., Park Ridge, before going into service June 20, 1941.

Shortly before leaving the country, Lt. Carl married the former Miss Beatrice Pollock of Des Plaines, who survives. He also leaves three sisters and two brothers, one of the latter being Lt. [J. G.] Herbert Carl, who is with the navy in the Pacific area.
