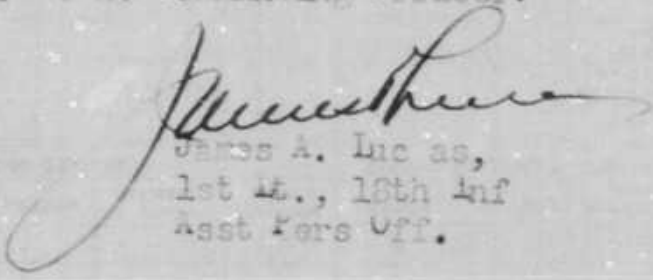
6 June 1944 East of St. Laurent-sur-Mer, France

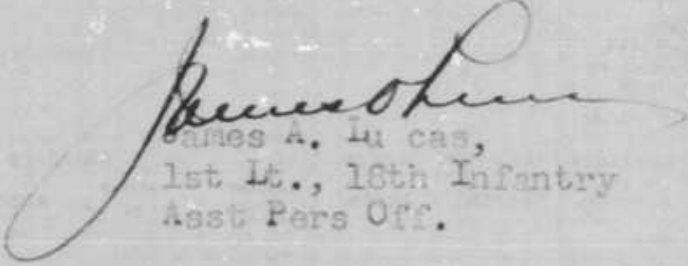
