2 July 44 -- Co. still in defensive position with Preparations being made for attack to high ground to our front.

3 July 44—Co. moved out on attack 0630. Arrived within short distance where enemy pinned us down then shelled heavy. Intire Bn. withdrew to Bn. area and set up defense for night.

4 July 44—Co. moved from one defensive position to another to

protect our left flank.

5 July 44 -- Co. moved out to fill gap
in 3rd Bn. area. Moved up under
heavy shelling. Held position, sent
out ten man patrol to contact right
flank organization. After position
was secure Co. moved out to former
area, Moved again to entire Bn. moved forward cleaning out area which
