Rites Are Set For Victim Of War

Funeral services for Private First Class Evan Spillman of Ceres, who was killed in France on June 11, 1944, will be held Tuesday afternoon at 3 o'clock in the Franklin-Savage & Downs Funeral Home.

Spillman was serving with the Tropic-Ohio section of the 70th Division, 20th Infantry, at the time of his death. He attended school in this area.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Evan Spillman of Ceres and the brother of Jesse Spillman and Mrs. Arlene Keith of Modesto. He was born in Missouri, aged 28 years.

Rev. Winmuth, pastor of the Huguenot Church of Christ, will officiate at the funeral. Graveside services will be conducted at the veterans section of the Hansen Cemetery by a detachment from Castle Air Force Base and local veterans organizations.
