1st Lt John H. Townley, O-1184317, 231st Armored FA Battalion was killed in action 3 August 1944 in the vicinity of Dol de Bretagne, Ille et Vilaine. Died at a German first aid station. A report from Hq 231st Armd FA Battalion states "a wound starting at the buttocks and emerging from the base of the neck was noticeable. Remains were not burned".
