Dear Mr. and Mrs. Evans:

Reference is made to letter from this Office dated 4 October 1949 advising that the remains of your son, the late First Sergeant William S. Evans, were included as part of a group scheduled for final interment in the Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery at St. Louis, Missouri. Subsequently this Office advised you by letter dated 23 June 1950 that the group had been suspended overseas pending a further investigation to determine if the remains could be segregated to allow for individual identification.

The investigation, which included an examination of the remains by an accredited anthropologist, is now complete; however, I regret to advise that the investigation failed to accomplish individual identification of any of the remains included in the group. They will, therefore, be returned as a group representing the recoverable remains of your son and twenty of his comrades with final interment in the Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery.

Please be assured that you will be notified of the date and time of interment sufficiently in advance to permit your attendance at the final burial ceremonies.

Realizing how anxiously you have been waiting to receive this information, I wish to advise you of the pertinent facts of the case, as revealed by Department of the Army records and the reports received from our overseas Command.

Your son was a crew member aboard a C-47 type aircraft, serial number 42-93095, which crashed at Beuzeville, Normandy, France, on 6 June 1944, while on a "paradrop" mission over Cherbourg Peninsula. This plane was carrying a total of twenty-two men, all of whom were killed as a result of the crash.

Subsequent investigation disclosed that the remains of the pilot had been recovered, individually identified and interred in the United States Military Cemetery St. Mere Eglise #1, France. It was further ascertained that the remains of other crew members, which were not identifiable individually, had been interred in the Cemetery at St. Martin, France. At the time these remains were recovered, identification tags for five of the men known to be aboard Aircraft #42-93095 at the time it crashed were also found. Your letter concerning your son, the late First Sergeant William S. Evans, has been received in this office.

Units of the American Graves Registration Service are now engaged in searching operations in an endeavor to locate the remains of deceased Americans. As yet, however, no report has been received that your son's remains have been discovered.

Information being utilized by these searching units includes data gathered from captured enemy records, from reports submitted by various commanders as well as fellow soldiers, and from reports rendered after the interrogation of returned prisoners of war.

I sincerely hope that this intensive search will result in the discovery and identification of your son's remains. Please be assured that when further information is received, you will be informed with a minimum of delay.

The War Department has now been authorized to remove, at Government expense, to the final resting place designated by the next of kin, the remains of those American citizens who died while serving overseas with our armed forces during this war.

When the necessary preliminaries have been completed, a letter with an information pamphlet and a "Request for Disposition" form attached will be sent to the next of kin of those American dead. The "Request for Disposition" form, when properly filled out, will constitute the formal expression of the next of kin's detailed desires. Since letters to next of kin will be dispatched automatically and ac-

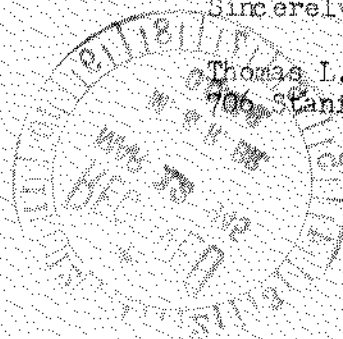


