Pfc. David Joganic Killed in France

GRAY — Pfc. David Joganic, 31, was killed in action with the infantry in France on June 19, the War Department informed his mother, Mrs. Barbara Joganic of Gray.

The soldier was inducted into the armed forces on Apr. 30, 1942, and trained in the States for approximately 18 months before going overseas. He formerly was engaged in

automobile repair work here and operated the Johnstown Tribune agency at Gray from 1924 until entering the Army.

In addition to his mother, he leaves a sister, Mrs. Ann Lomagro, Midland, and two brothers, Steve, at home, and Frank, Pittsburgh.
