Pvt. Earl Hoag Of Athens Dies Of War Wounds

Pvt. Earl A. Hoag, 21-year-old son of Mrs. Esther Reid and Earl Hoag of Athens died of wounds suffered in action with American invasion forces in France on July

8, according to an official communication from the war department in Washington, D. C., received today by his parents.

On Monday of this week parents of the former Athens youth were notified by the war department that he was seriously wounded in France on June 29. His last letter to his father was written on June 27 in which he stated that he was getting along all right.

Private Hoag entered the army Dec. 8, 1942. He was assigned to the infantry and received his basic training at Camp Van Dorn, Miss. During his course of training there he received a certificate for high rank in marksmanship. Later he was transferred to Camp Blissett, Texas, and went overseas in January, 1944.

He was a graduate of Athens high school and for a time was employed in the Athens plant of the Ingersoll-Rand company before becoming a Lehigh Valley railroad locomotive fireman, a position he held at the time he entered the armed forces.

In addition to his mother and father he is survived by a sister, Mrs. Edward Pickering of North Scituate, R. I., and his grandmother, Mrs. Alice Hoag of 112 Herrick street, Athens.
