The Division gained a clear-cut bridgehead over the MERDERET River, relieved two of the three isolated groups and some members of the third, and continued its attack to the northwest in the LE HAM sector.

325th Glider Infantry Regiment

The 1st Battalion continued to press forward to reach the western approaches of the LA FIERRE Bridge but at 0400 hours was pinned down by heavy fire of all types in the vicinity of CANQUIGNY (309959). Following a 15-minute artillery preparation, the 3d Battalion attacked across the LA FIERRE Bridge at 1050 hours with two companies of the 507th Parachute Infantry and supported by Company C, 746th Tank Battalion. A bridgehead was established despite heavy losses. CANQUIGNY was secured by 1330 hours and the 3d Battalion was linked up with the 1st Battalion, 325th, on the left and with the 2d Battalion, 507th on the right. Only a small portion of the group west of MAREVILLE succeeded in reaching our lines. An enemy counterattack lasting from 1900 to 2100 was repulsed successively by the 3d Battalion and the 507th Parachute Infantry.
