D RING 52 - 5 JULY 1944

The Division secured all of the area within its zone of action, mopping up all remaining pockets of enemy resistance, consolidating defensive positions and maintaining contact with the adjacent units in their advance to pin off the Division. Corps orders restrained the Division from further advances. Defensive positions were established along the general line from Hill 151 south along the ST. AUBIN LE VIELLE - LA RIVE DU RUITZ Highway to the southern slopes of Hill 95 and thence along the southern slope of the LA ROTRUE Ridge.

22nd Glider Infantry Regiment

The regiment established a defensive line on the forward slopes of the LA ROTRUE Ridge with the 3d Battalion, 507th Parachute Infantry, attached, on the regiment's right flank. Contact was maintained with the advancing 90th Infantry Division on the left.

On 5 July, as the attack moved into La Poterie, the Germans mounted a counterattack with a tank accompanied by a force of infantry. This force, moving along a narrow road, was gaining ground against the under-strength riflemen of the 325. Pfc James Geach, serving with the Heavy Weapons Company, 1st Battalion, took action on his own initiative.
