5 July 44 Remained in Defensive Position.

6 July 44 Dawn found the Company trying to withdraw from Hill 95. We were pinned down by Enemy Fire as we dug in a hedge row. Two LMG's came forward, as they opened fire the men withdrew at 0730 hr. 1 TD came forward and the Company went to the top and moved under TD fire. The men fought until out of Ammo and grenades, they then withdrew at 0945 hr. 3 TD's came forward and blasted the dugout, killing the occupants and cleared out the
