In 1970 the National Research Council first compiled this for statistical purposes using the EMTs (Emergency Medical Tags) and other Office of the Surgeon General Office Records during WWII.

Private Albert H. Kassekert, an employe of The Inquirer, was killed in action in France on June 14, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Kassekert, of 2106 N. Broad st., have been informed by the War Department.

Private Kassekert, who was employed in The Inquirer ad composing room, was an infantryman and received his basic training at Camp Van Dorn, Miss. He went overseas early this year.

His father, Paul, is a veteran of World War I, and holds the Distinguished Service Cross for bravery in action and the Purple Heart.
