Record Of Events

June 5 Boarded planes at Barkeaton Heath at 2200 took off from airport 2358.

June 6 Somewhere in Normandy. Jumped 3000 yds E of Gourbeville at 0238. DZ flooded and men were forced to drop equipment and swim for it or drown in certain cases. Fighting the remainder of day led to the occupation of an area E of the Merderet River from St. Mere-Eglise to Chef-Du-Pont. Units were largely mixed groups with members from all regiments fighting under strange leaders.

June 7 All 507th Pchnt Inf men were pulled out at 1000 and drawn back organized by companies. Supported 505th Pchnt Inf in sector N of St. Mere-Eglise. When contact was made with the 4th Div. at about 1400 the regiment withdrew to a rear area and after a four ~~day~~ hour rest moved up to a bivouac area about 2000 yds W of St. Mere-Eglise. 1. D-DAY 0230, MAIN BODY 507 PARA INF LANDED AND COMMENCED ASSEMBLY UNDER HEAVY FIRE.

2. D-DAY 0400, COL MILLETT LANDED, GATHERED 40 MEN AND ATTACKED AMPREVILLE. HE MOVED TO VIC. LES LANDES AT 1300 THAT DAY.

3. D-DAY 0400, LT COL'S MALONEY AND OSTBERG ASSEMBLED 150 MEN.

4. D-DAY 0600, LT COL MALONEY MOVED AND GATHERED 400 MEN. CAPT SCHWARTZ-WALDER, CROSSED LA FIERE BRIDGE WITH 80 MEN OF G CO AT 1500.

5. D-DAY 0900, CAPT DICKERSON'S FORCE OF 300 MEN REMAINED IN RESERVE AT THIS POINT.

6. D-DAY 1200, LT COL OSTBERG MOVED TO THIS POINT WITH 75 MEN. CAPT CREEK AND 100 MEN TOOK CHEF DU PONT BRIDGE AT 2100. CAPT CREEK WAS RELIEVED BY 50B AND REJOINED THE REGT AT 0900 D+1.

7. D-DAY 2100-2400, LT COL MALONEY ENTERED FIGHT FOR LA FIERE BRIDGE WITH 400 MEN.

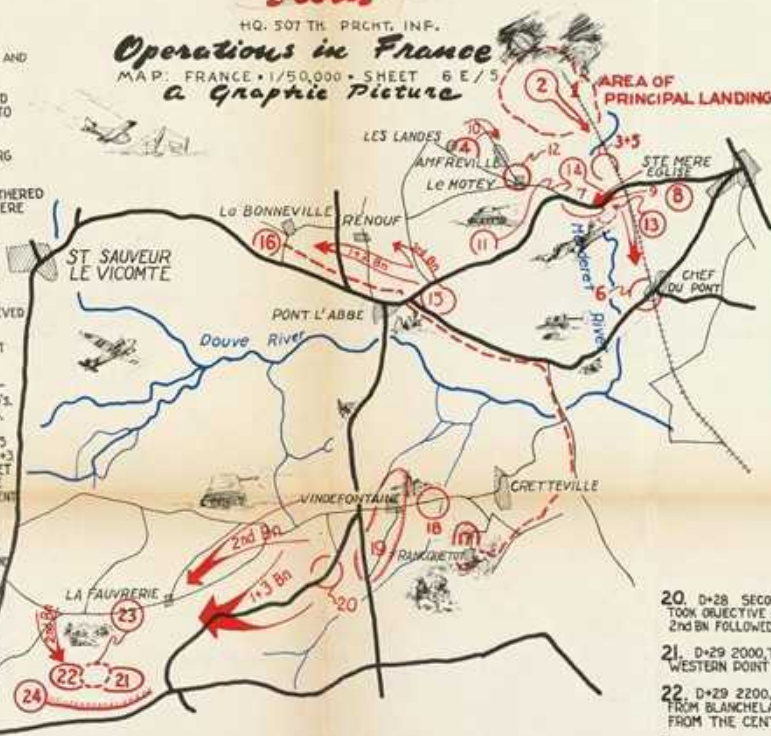
