D PLUS 8 -- 14 JUNE 1944

508th Parachute Infantry Regiment

The 1st Battalion moved from the vicinity of COIGNY to assist the 2 Battalion clear BAUPTE at 0130 hours. The 3d Battalion repelled a sharp counterattack at 0700 hours in the vicinity of HOTOT. The enemy attempted to break through the 3d Battalion positions again at 1005 hours, but the attack failed after the enemy sustained heavy casualties. The highway and railroad bridges southwest of HOTOT were blown by attached elements of the 507th Airborne Engineer Battalion moved from BAUPTE to the northwest at 1030 and attacked PONT AURY to dislodge an enemy concentration building up in that area. After a sharp fire fight the 1st Battalion broke contact at 1600 hours and withdrew toward BAUPTE, assembling in a reserve position in the vicinity of FRACQUENT. The 2d Battalion left Company D at BAUPTE and moved at 2300 hours to a position in the vicinity of COIGNY.
