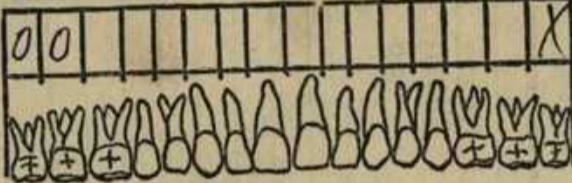

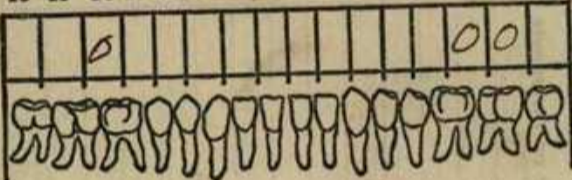

1. Reference is made to reports of burial for Unknown X-9, in the US Military Cemetery #1, Champigneul, France, plot A, row 6, grave 132 and Unknown X-10, in St Mere Eglise Cemetery #1, France, plot D, row 6, grave 120, respectively.

2. The fingerprints submitted were compared with those on file in the Adjutant General's Office of soldiers known to have been missing in action in France, and also those on file in the Federal Bureau of Investigation, without effecting an identification.

3. It is requested that the organizations known to have been in the area of the casualties, be interrogated as to personnel known to have been killed or missing and for whom reports of burial have not been received.

SUBJECT: Identification of Unknowns

TO : Commanding Officer, 544th QM Bn., APO 562, U S Army.

1. In compliance with requests of Operational Memorandum #1 American Graves Registration Command, Headquarters Western Zone, 531st QM Group, APO 562, dated 23 October 1945; the remains of seventeen Unknowns at St Mere Eglise #1 were disinterred, Tooth Charts and Check Lists were prepared and are submitted here-with.

2. Attention is especially invited to Check Lists for Unknowns X-24 and X-25. From all the evidence presented and from our own observation it is believed that they are the remains of two English, either Navy or Merchant Marine. To further substantiate this fact the two above mentioned Unknown deceased were buried about the same time as three other Unknowns X-17, X-21, and X-26 since Identified as British and transferred to British Cemetery at Bayeux.

3. Of the 18 Unknowns buried 17 were disinterred and processed the remaining one having been disinterred and processed within the past month and Check Lists with Tooth Charts submitted at that time.

Most of the deceased Unknowns in this Cemetery were D-Day and Invasion casualties and many were never removed from the water for days after they were killed thus facilitating decomposition to such an extent that most of the recognizable features requested in check lists are decomposed.

Some bodies were practically disintegrated by direct hits, mines, and etc., this plus the fact that they have been buried over a year makes it difficult to give positive answers to question in Check Lists; however whenever possible reasonable estimations have been made in sizes, weights, and measurements.

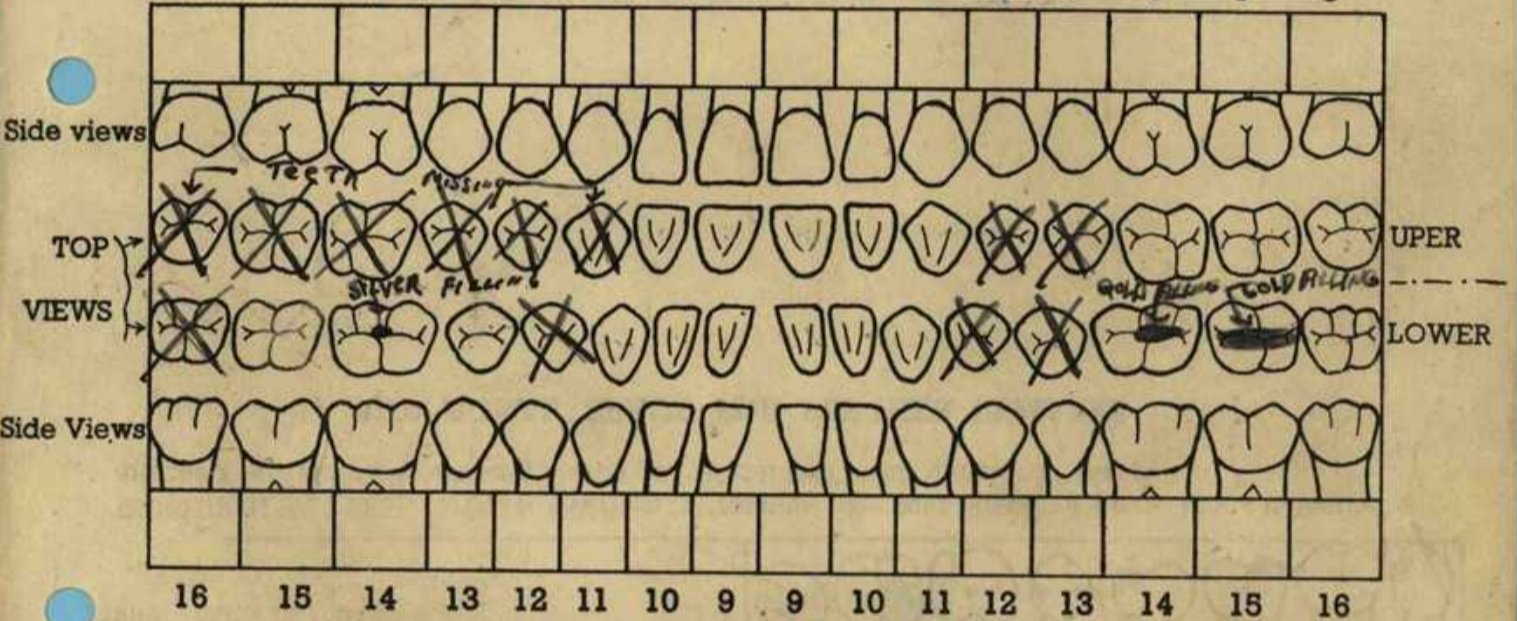
