Co encountered enemy resistance and took 7 prisoners 3 of which were wounded. Co moved from this position at 2330 hrs. At 0144 the Bn arrived at assembly area at 0030 hrs and dug in. At 0730 Bn relieved 2nd Bn in the attack. Heavy resistance with mortar and artillery held up Co for approx 2 hrs. A 6 man patrol was sent out to flank and knock out enemy position so Co could move on to the road at coord 216-856. Co F captured 9 prisoners.
