Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

6. Upon repatriation, Lieutenant Colonel Nathaniel R. Hoskot, O-302774, the witness referred to above, made the following statement concerning subject personnel to Captain (then Lieutenant) Harry V. Bair, Casualty Branch, AGO, at Walter Reed Hospital, 25 January 1945:

"I was with the 82nd Airborne Division and was captured with a number of paratroopers behind the German Lines on 6 June 1944. The next day, 7 June 1944, we were being transported in 10 German trucks when our column was strafed by American planes. The following men were killed by the strafing:

"The above named men are buried in the village cemetery in a mass grave at Les Mesnil Bigot, Dept. Of Manche, Normandy, France. I read the services at the burial. The French dug the graves and the mayor of the town told me they would mark the grave with a cross. I gave him the name of each man or one of the dog tags."

7. Evaluation of Facts.

a. Captain Flanders, Lieutenants Insley and Kuhn, and Privates Lane and Wood were reported missing in action in France since 6 June 1944 and have remained in that status since clarifying details as to their fate were not available. Dispatch from the American Legation, Bern, Switzerland, however, advised that, according to testimony of Lieutenant Colonel Nathaniel R. Hoskot, 0302774, Lieutenant Insley and Privates Lane and Wood were killed by small arms fire on 7 June 1944 at Les Mesnil Bigot, France, and that Captain Flanders and Lieutenant Kuhn were dead also, having been buried 7 June 1944 at Les Mesnil Bigot, France. Upon Colonel Hoskot's return to the United States as a repatriated prisoner of War, he confirmed this information, advising that he, Captain Flanders, Lieutenants Insley and Kuhn, and Privates Lane and Wood were among many prisoners of war being moved in trucks by the Germans. When the truck convoy was strafed by American planes on 7 June 1944 near Les Mesnil Bigot, France, these men were killed. Colonel Hoskot further advised that he assisted in their burial at Les Mesnil Bigot.

b. After having been reported missing in action since 6 June 1944. Captain Creary, Lieutenant Shankey, Corporal McKeeby, and Privates Evert, House, Carriere, Heinz, Slane and Turner were reported killed in action 1 July 1944. Likewise, Lieutenant Donlan and Private Bolin were reported killed in action on 1 July 1944, although they became missing in action 7 June 1944. Private Scholz, who was reported missing in action 6 June 1944, was reported to have been killed in action on the same date. According to Colonel Hoskot, however, Corporal McKeeby and Privates Bolin, Carriere, Evert, Heinz, House, Scholz, Slane and Turner were killed by small arms fire on 7 June 1944 at Les Mesnil Bigot, France, and buried there, and Captain Creary and Lieutenants Donlan and Shankey were buried at Les Mesnil Bigot, France, on 7 June 1944. Colonel Hoskot stated that these men were also victims of the 7 June 1944 strafing of the German truck convoy in which they were being transported.

c. Colonel Hoskot further reported that all of subject personnel were buried in one grave in the village cemetery at Les Mesnil Bigot, Department

of Manche, France, and that he read the burial service over them. The Mayor of the town assured Colonel Hoskot that the grave would be marked with a cross, and Colonel Hoskot furnished him the name or one identification tag of each man interred therein.

d. Most of the names of subject personnel furnished by Colonel Hoskot were correct. A few, however, were described by incomplete or misspelled names and all serial numbers were not supplied. In order to identify these, a thorough search of AG Casualty files, AG 201 files, AG numerical files, and the pertinent payroll rosters of the organizations to which the men reported to belong was necessary. Such search conclusively established the identity of these men as subject personnel.

8. Conclusion. Colonel Hoskot's eyewitness statements, as set forth above, are those of one in a position to know the facts and, as such, lead to no other logical conclusion than that subject personnel were killed in action 7 June 1944.

9. Recommendation. It is recommended, therefore, that the status of the following personnel be changed from "missing in action" to "killed in action" in France on 7 June 1944:

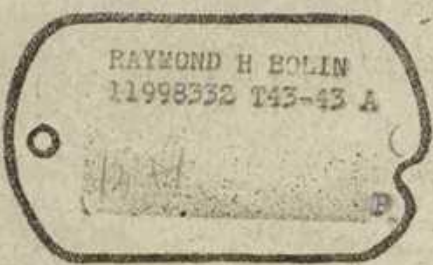

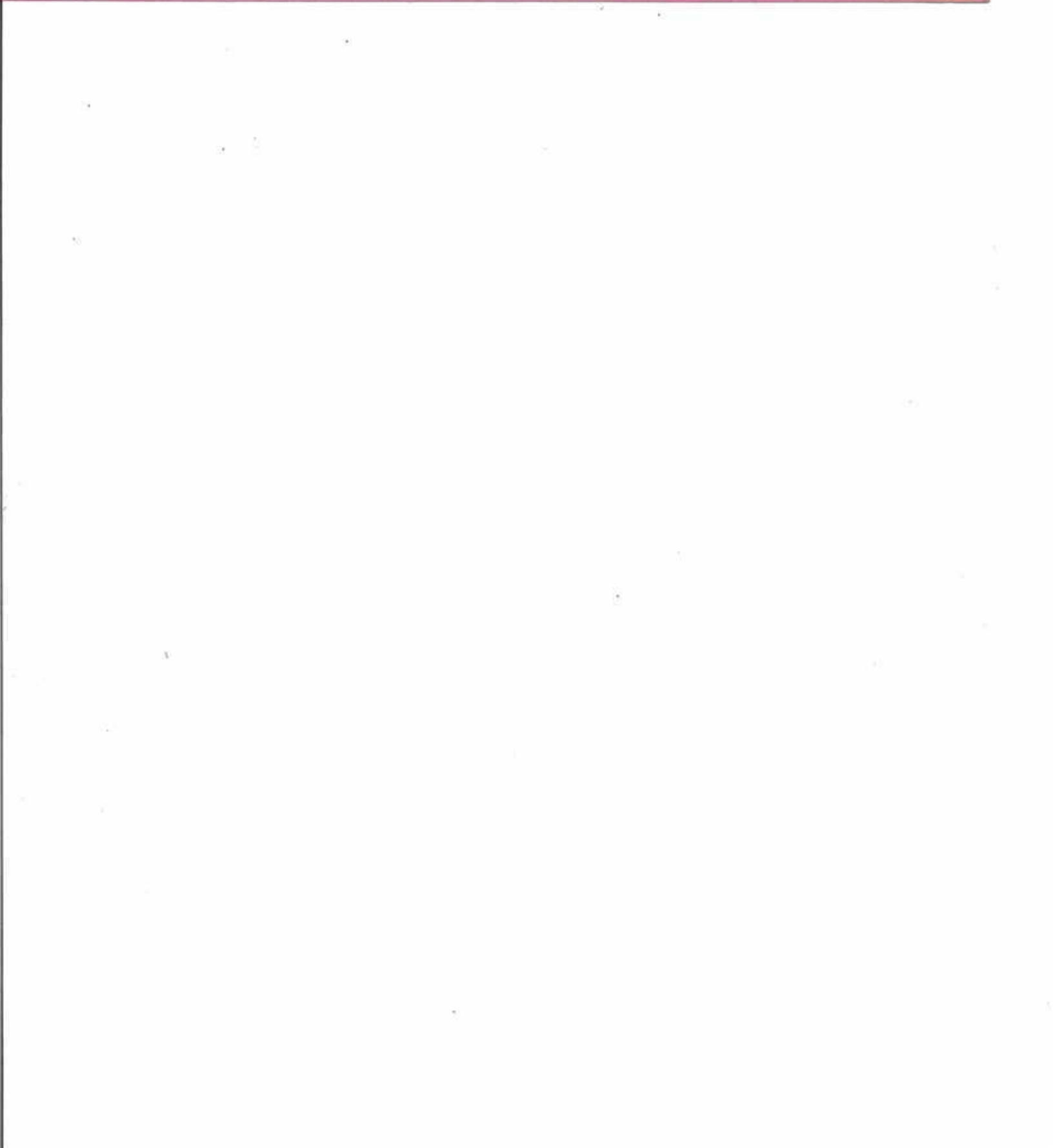
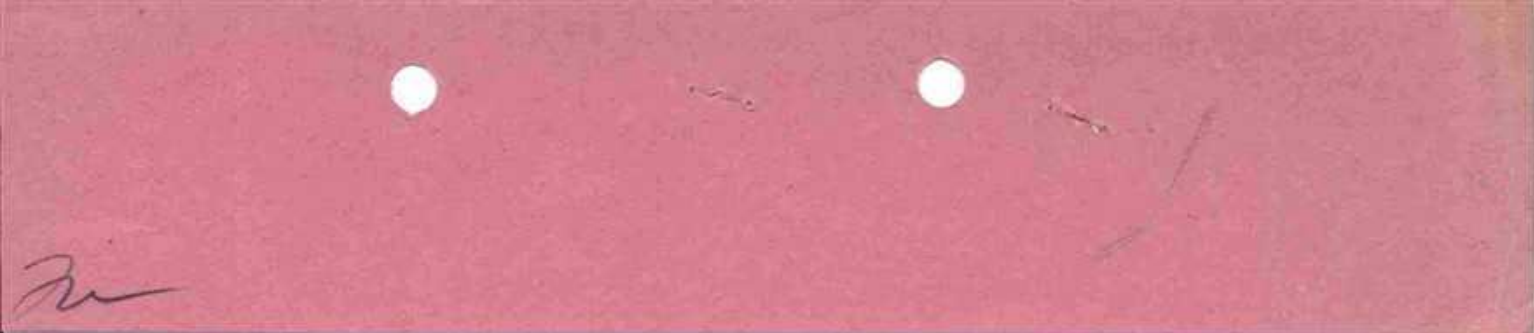
