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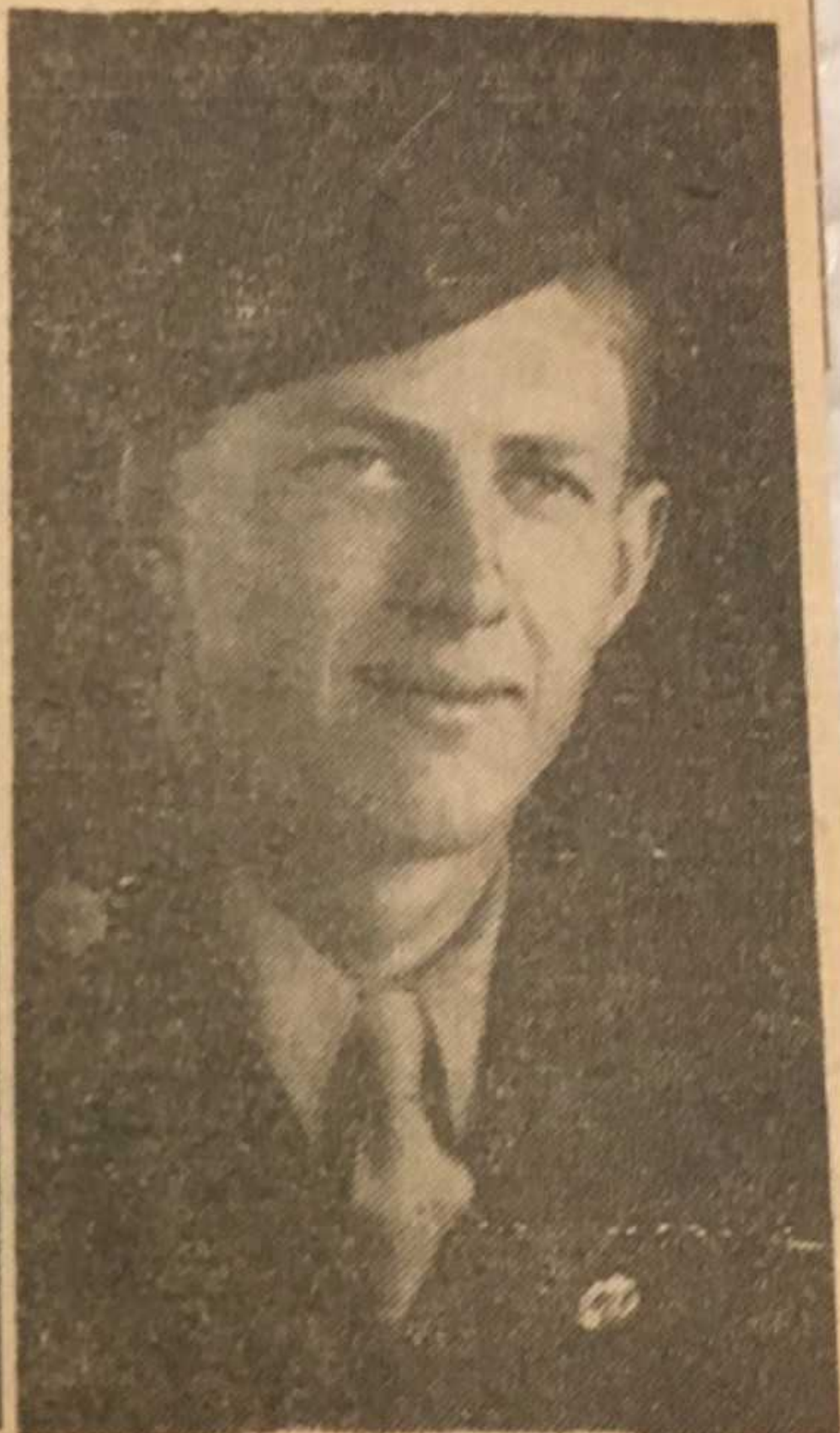
Vermilion Grove Sets Military Rites for 2

Vermilion Grove—(CNS)—Joint funeral services for Sgt. Peter Bessarab and Cpl. George Richard Jordan, Vermilion Grove war casualties, will be at 2 p. m. Sunday at the Vermilion Grove Friends Church.

The Rev. Allen Reynolds, pastor, will officiate and burial will be in Vermilion Grove Cemetery. American Legion Post 334 will conduct graveside rites. Friends may call at the Brewer Funeral Home, Ridgefarm, from 2 to 8:30 p. m. Saturday.

The body of Sergeant Bessarab will arrive Friday morning in Ridgefarm. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. David Bessarab, and formerly lived in Chicago. He entered armed service in February, 1942, at Camp Grant and was stationed at Camp Blanding, Fla., and Camp Edwards, Mass. He was sent overseas Apr. 1, 1943, and served in North Africa, Sicily and Southern Italy.

He was killed in battle near the Rapido River, near Cassino, Italy, Jan. 20, 1944, while serving with the Anti-tank Company of the 143d Infantry, 36th Division.

Besides his parents, he leaves his widow, a sister, Mrs. Ann McGovern, and a brother, Alexander, all of Chicago.

Corporal Jordan enlisted in the Airborne Division of the Infantry Dec. 2, 1942, at Flint, Mich. He received his basic training at Camp Mackall, N. C., and Camp Toccoa, Ga. He earned his wings at Fort Benning, Ga., and went overseas in January, 1944.

He was stationed in England until D-Day, and was killed serving with the 101st Airborne Infantry in the battle for Carentan Road, June 13, 1944.

Surviving besides his parents, George and Orpha Jordan, Vermilion Grove, are a brother, Paul, Vermilion Grove; three sisters, Mrs. Ruth Holstine, Kingman, Mrs. Ellen Steinkraus, Chicago, and Mrs. Mabel Bessarab, Vermilion Grove.

The body will arrive at Ridgefarm Friday morning from Chicago.
