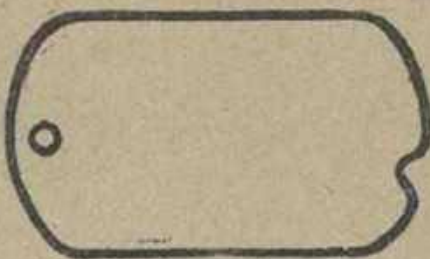

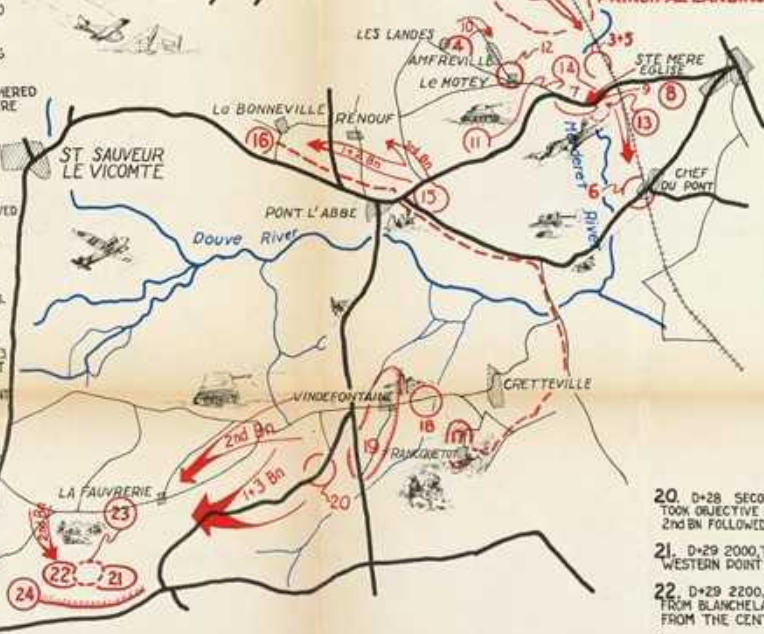

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George Elmo Boots

Wounds Prove Fatal To Corporal Boots

Cpl. George Elmo Boots, 22, a paratrooper with the United States Army, died of wounds received following the invasion of France, according to word received yesterday by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Boots of Lexington, Route 6. He was among the first 200 American soldiers who dropped onto French soil during the invasion D-Day. He was wounded July 3, according to an earlier notice from the War Department, and died July 5.

A native of the Paynes' Depot neighborhood, Boots was born in Scott county Dec. 31, 1921. He attended Great Crossing high school and farmed with his father until he enlisted on May 6, 1942. He had been overseas since last December. He was a member of the Methodist church.

Besides his parents, George W. and Margaret Lykins Boots, he is survived by two brothers, Wilmer Boots, Georgetown, Route 1. and Kenneth Boots, Fayette county; two sisters, Mrs. Robert Moss, Fayette county, and Mrs. Margaret Boots Clarke, Louisville, and his paternal grandmother, Mrs. Susan Emily Boots, Fayette county.
