Former Local Man Killed in Action

Pfc. William Horan, 21, son of Mrs. August Frederick of Garrett Hill, a former well-known local resident, was killed in action in the Cherbourg sector on June 14. It was revealed in a telegram received by his mother from the War Department Friday afternoon.

Pfc. Horan was born in Paoli but lived most of his life in this borough. He removed to Garrett Hill a few years ago. He attended the local schools and was employed in the shipping department of the Glassine Paper Company, West Conshohocken, prior to his induction about eighteen months ago.

He is survived by his mother and a brother, Edward, serving with the U. S. Army Air Forces in France.

While in this borough, the family resided at 930 Maple street.
