James Toogood, 23, Killed in Action

According to word received by his wife who resides at 1215 Seventeenth street, Rock Island, Pfc. James Toogood, 23, a former resident, was killed in action June 11. Location of his death was not announced, but it presumably was in France. In a letter written on June 10 he told of leaving England on a ship.

A resident of Rock Island for 18 months, Pvt. Toogood was employed at the J. I. Case Co. plant and was inducted Sept. 2, 1943. He was in an infantry division and trained at Camp Van Dorn, Miss., and Ft. Dix, N. J.

Pfc. Toogood was born in Arkansas Dec. 5, 1920, and married Miss Adeline Verdeck of Rock Island in November, 1943, at Centreville, Miss. He is survived by three brothers, John, Ft. Worth, Tex.; Theodore, Kansas; Henry, now in the army, and four sisters, Mollie, Arizona; Nellie, Kentucky; Nora, Texas, and Katherine in Kansas.
