Services Sunday For Pfc Anderson

Military services will be held at 3 p m Sunday in Aaron cemetery for Pfc Joseph A Anderson, Wakulla serviceman killed in France in 1944.

Rev C C Scarborough will officiate. Military honors will be in charge of the Wakulla post of American Legion.

Pfc Anderson was born in Wakulla county, Aug 15, 1915. He attended school in Wakulla and went into military service in February, 1941.

He was a member of the infantry forces and was awarded the Purple Heart, posthumously.

Survivors include four sisters, Mrs Eva Pararo, Mrs Mable Kelly, and Mrs Annie Carmack, of Tallahassee, Mrs Arie Harvey of Woodville, four brothers, C K of Woodville, Bond of Jacksonville, Clarence of Kissimmee and Jessie and John of Tallahassee.
