James Heacock is First Local Victim of Normandy Invasion.

RAISES LOCAL DEATH TOLL TO 11

The first local young man to pay the supreme sacrifice during the Normandy invasion was Pvt. James Heacock, 19, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Heacock of Greenville, N. D. His death on June 23 somewhere in France brought this community's toll in World War II dead to 11.

Pvt. Heacock, attached to the 82nd Parachute Infantry, was wounded on D-Day, June 6, and died a week later in an Allied hospital.

A son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Heacock, Pvt. Heacock attended Penn High School and was employed at the Greenville Steel Co. Company when he entered the Army a little over a year ago.

Pvt. Heacock originally was in tank reconnaissance at Camp Campbell, Ky., and later was transferred to Fort Benning, Ga., for training as a paratrooper. He received his wings at Fort Benning and after 1 1/2 months in the paratroops was sent to Ireland. Two weeks later he went to England where he had his first meeting in two years with his brother, 8-Sgt. Foster L. Heacock of the Army Air Forces.

On Oct. 7, 1942, Pvt. Heacock was married at Dickson, Tenn., to Miss Ethel Blake of that city. His wife now makes her home with her husband's parents. A sister, Dorothy Mae Heacock, is employed at the Camp Reynolds Post Office.
