# Pvt. G. H. Timmerman

Funeral services for Pvt. George H. Timmerman, 31, Dover, soldier who was killed on June 6th, 1944, on the Normandy beachhead, will be held at 2 p. m., Wednesday, at the Calvary 4-Square Gospel church East Slingluff avenue, Dover, with the Rev. E. E. Dennison officiating. Burial will be made in Maple Grove cemetery where military rites will be in charge of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Friends may call at the Lewis Funeral Home in Dover from 2 to 4 p. m. and 7 to 9 p. m. tomorrow. The body will be taken to the church at noon Wednesday.

The body of Pvt. Timmerman, who was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Timmerman, arrived in Dennison this afternoon escorted by T-5 Edward I. Smith.

Before entering the service, Pvt. Timmerman was an employe of The Reeves Steel & Mfg. Co., Dover. He was inducted into the service on April 20, 1942, took his basic training at Ft. Meade, Md., and went overseas on October 5, 1942. He was serving with the 125th Combat Battalion of the 29th Infantry when he met his death.

His body arrived in New York City three weeks ago.

Surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Charles Heidy, Dover, and Mrs. Martha Cotton, Rittman, and three brothers, Adam, Newcomerstown; Austin, Dover, and Joseph, this city.
