SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during groun air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specifi information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Offic and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche. have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, fo the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file Quarter 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Roturn of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of Private First Class James T. Harper, 35671355, Infantry.

- 1. Private First Class James T. Harper, 85671855, Infantry, was initially reported as seriously wounded in action on 6 June 1944, not in flying or jump status, by Casualty Shipment No. 098, ETO, and his status was subsequently changed to missing in action as of the same date, by Casualty Shipment No. 263, ETO. He was presumed dead as of 7 June 1945, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act.
 - 2. Notations on his Qualification Card, filed in his AG 201 file, and also under the heading, "REMARKS--ADMINISTRATIVE" in his Service Record, shows that he was seriously wounded by a gunshot wound in the right eye lid in the vicinity of Ravenoville, located on the east coast of the Cherbourg Peninsula. Under date of 19 April 1945, this office dispatched a communication, ACPC-S 201 Harper, James T. (19 Apr 45), to the Commanding General, ETOUSA, requesting the circumstances forming the basis for the change of this soldier's status be submitted to this office. One inclosure was added to the basic communication by Third Indorsement, dated 2 May 1945, at Headquarters, 4th Infantry Division. The inclosure, which is a letter, dated 2 May 1945, from Headquarters, 22nd Infantry, to the Commanding General, 4th Infantry Division, reads, in part, as follows:
 - "1. Private First Class James T. Harper, 35671855, *L* Company, 22nd Infantry was reported *SWA* 6 June 1944. The fact that the soldier became a casualty is substantiated by a Battalion Aid Station Admission and Disposition Sheet.
 - "2. The soldier was wounded upon landing on the beach on 'D' Day, 6
 June 1944. He was treated at the battalion aid station and evacuated for
 further treatment. *** The Division clearing company was not in operation
 at this time and it is not known what organization handled the evacuation
 of the wounded from the beachhead. There is no other information available

 - a. Fifth Indorsement, dated 6_May 1945, which was added to the basic communication at Headquarters, ETOUSA, indicated there is no further information available concerning Private First Class Harper's status.
 - 3. An examination of the index in Prisoner of War information Bureau, PMCO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review. The Quartermaster General's Office, Memorial Division, (Mr. Fryncko) reports that there is no burial report of record in that office, nor any favorable Unknowns in the Normandy northern France area to be associated with Pfc. Harper. The Captured German Records, now of record in this office, fail to reveal the name of Pfc Harper.





Examination of Casualty Branch records of Private First Class James T. Harper, who is named in paragraph lg, above, shows that he was also initailly reported as a casualty on 6 June 1944 in the status of seriously wounded in action by ETO shipment number 098, and that his status was subsequently changed to missing in action as of the same date. Notations on his Qualification Card, filed with his AG 201 file, and also under the heading, "REMARKS __ADMINISTRATIVE" in his Service Record, show that he was seriously wounded by a gunshot wound in the right eye lid in the vicinity of Ravenoville, located on the east coast of the Cherbourg Peninsula. Under date of 19 April 1945, this office dispatched a confidential communication, AGPC_S 201 Harper, James T. (19 Apr 45), to the Commanding General, ETOUSA, requesting the circumstances forming the basis for the change of this soldier's status be submitted to this office. On inclosure was added to the basic communication by Third Indorsement, dated 2 May 1945 at Headquarters, 4th Infantry Division. The inclosure, which is a letter, dated 2 May 1945 from Headquarters, 22nd Infantry, to the Commanding General, 4th Infantry Division, reads, in part, as follows:

"1. Private First Class James T. Harper 35671355, 'L' Company, 22nd Infantry was reported 'SWA' 6 June 1944. The fact that the soldier became a casualty is substantiated by a Battalion Aid Station Admission and Disposition Sheet.

"2. The soldier was wounded upon landing on the beach on 'D' Day, 6 June 1944. He was treated at the battalion aid station and evacuated for fur-

ther treatment. *** The division clearing company was not in operation at this time and it is not known what organization handled the evacuation of the wounded from the beachhead. There is no other information available on this soldier. No one can be found who has seen or heard from him since 6 June 1944. The soldier never returned to duty nor has the casualty section ever received a burial report on the soldier. ***

a. Fifth Indorsement, dated 6 May 1945, which was added to the basic communication at Headquarters, ETOUSA, indicates there is no further information available concerning Harper's status.

II. CONCLUSIONS

- 1. The persons whose status is herein under consideration became missing in action 6 June 1944, while participating in the initial assault on the northern coast of France, which marked the beginning of the invasion of Western Europe by Allied forces. Major landings were effected on the beaches east of the Cherbourg Peninsula (Omaha Beach) with secondary landings being made on the east coast of the peninsula itself (Utah Beach). Intense enemy opposition was encountered both during the landings and after beachheads had been established. Many of the subject personnel were last observed in landing boats and other craft approaching the beach under heavy enemy fire. Some of the craft were hit and observed to sink or capsize causing numerous casualties. Other personnel were last seen on the beaches, which were being subjected to enemy artillery, mortar and machine-gun fire and occasional straffing and bombing by enemy planes.
- 2. A period of twelve months has elapsed since the day the invasion of France began. An examination of all pertinent records and reports available to the War Department fails to indicate that any of the subject personnel have been seen or heard from by anyone since that date except in the case of First Sergeant Sandy Martin, Jr. Martin was last seen alive on the day following the initial assault, although he had been seriously wounded. He and a number of other subject personnel were initially reported as casualties in a "wounded" or "injured" status and such status was subsequently changed to missing in action, based on canvasses of hospitals and other installations and examination of records which failed to reveal that they had been hospit-lized or evacuated subsequent to the time they were wounded.
- 3. In view of the non-receipt of any report that would provide adequate basis for presuming that one or more of the subject personnel may still be living and due to the intense overall battle conditions under which these persons disappeared, it is concluded that they may not "reasonably be presumed to be living" within the meaning of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act.

III - RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that findings of death be made under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act in the cases of the forty-two persons named in paragraph 1, Part I, of this review, and that these findings show the presumed date of death, in each case, to be 7 june 1945.



HEADQUARTERS, 22ND INFANTRY

After Action Report

On 6 June 1944 the Allied Expeditionary Force landed on the coast of France. The 22nd Infantry, 4th Infantry Division, landed on Utah Beach starting at H plus 75 minutes. The Third Battalion, 22nd Infantry, initially attached to the 8th Infantry, landed in small craft with the mission of crossing the beach seawall, turning to the northwest, and reducing the fortified positions along the coast. The First and Second Battalions landed in LCI's, crossed the beach and inundated area, with the mission of attacking to the northwest, reducing the strong points at Crisbecq and Azeville, and then securing the high ground west and southwest of Quineville. The landing was made approximately 1500 yards south of the proposed beach. By nightfall, the Regiment was short of the initial objective, but had reached the general line Utah Beach-Foucarville.

On the morning 7 June, the Regiment continued the attack. The Third Battalion continued the attack on the beach strong points; the Second Battalion moved forward and launced an attack on the strong point northeast of Azeville; the First Battalion moved through Ravenoville. St Marcouf, and attacked the strong point near Crisbecq. Later in the afternoon the First and Second Battalions received counterattacks in some force and were driven back about 800 yards. During the night the First Battalion received another counterattack at about 0040 and repulsed this action without casualties.




