We are desirous that you be furnished information concerning the resting place of the remains of your son, the late Private First Class John J. Hannon.

The official report of burial has been received and discloses that the remains of your son were originally buried in an isolated grave located at Groesbeek, Holland, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel, properly identified, and reinterred in Plot SS, Row 8, Grave 19h, in the United States Military Cemetery Margraten, Holland, located ten miles west of Aachen, Germany.

The report further indicates that these remains have now been casketed and are being held at that cemetery pending disposition instructions from the next of kin, either for return to the United States or for permanent burial in an overseas cemetery.

There are inclosed informational pamphlets regarding the Return of World War II Dead Program, including a Disposition Form on which you may indicate your desires in this matter. Upon receipt of the properly completed form, you may be assured that the Department of the Army will attempt to comply with your instructions as indicated thereon.

## REMARKS

The remains of Unknown X-1929 were recovered from Groesbeek, Holland, estimated date of death September 1944. Sketch of isolated grave shows the remains were buried in Woods near Mook, Holland.

Army records reveal that Pfc. John J. Hannon, 12139651, KIA 30 September 1944, was a member of 401st Glider Infantry Regiment, 101st Airborne Division, who failed to return from a mission while engaged in combat with the enemy in vicinity of Kiekberg Forest, Holland.

Story of 101st Airborne Division indicates that during the last days of September 1944, paratroopers and glidermen fought the enemy heavily, on a strip of land between Nederrijn and Waal Rivers with Arnhem to the north and Nijmegen to the south.

Clothing found with remains are in agreement with Branch of Service for Pfc. Hannon.

Comparison of tooth chart for Unknown X-1929 is favorable with Army dental records for subject deceased.

Height, weight and color of hair for Unknown X-1929 are very favorable with height, weight and color of hair for Pfc. Hannon.

Paratrooper boot size for Unknown X-1929 is identical to shoe size for Pfc. Hannon.

There are eight other Unknowns, on file, with place of death indicated as Groesbeek, Holland, which can be eliminated by dental and physical comparison.

## THE STORY OF THE 101st AIRBORNE DIVISION

\*\*\*\*\* Sept. 24, a fresh German thrust cut the supply line between Vechel and St. Odenrode. Eagle soldiers combined with British tanks to smash German defenses and again reopen the road. Thereafter the thunderous roar of armor and supply trucks rolling up the highway continued uninterrupted.

Meanwhile, Gen. Taylor shuttled troops up and down both sides of the British Second Army's supply route to repulse German forces determined to sever Gen. Dempsey's lifeline.

Airborne troops, glidermen and paratroopers plugged gaps in the line with courage and M-1 rifles.

During the campaign in the canal-divided lowlands, hard-hitting Eagle paratroopers and glidermen again met a reorganized Normandy foe, the German 6th Parachute Regt. This crack German unit fared no better than before, sustaining heavy casualties which forced its early removal from the 101st sector.

Following this behind-the-enemy-lines "Airborne phase," the 101st moved to an area which soon became known to troops as the "Island." This strip of land was located between the Nederijn and Wall Rivers with Arnhem to the north, Nijmegen to the south.

Arrival of the Screaming Eagle on the Island marked the beginning of the end for Germany's 363rd Volksgrenadier Div. Taking over a quiet sector of the Island, the 101st prepared defensive positions.

Within 24 hours Germans struck from the west, slamming their 957th Regt. hard against the Airborne wall. Told it was opposing a handful of isolated Allied parachutists, hungry and without adequate weapons, the Nazi regiment attacked, confidently and swiftly.

The assault was absorbed by the depth of the 101st defense. The enemy was stunned at the savage reception accorded him by the "handful of Allied parachutists, hungry and without adequate weapons." Doggedly, the Germans drove--into destruction. Soon, the 957th Regt. ceased to exist as a fighting tactical unit.

But the savage warfare wasn't over. Germans reorganized battered elements and the 968th Regt. arrived the next day to join its faltering fellow regiment. German artillery and armor supported a fresh attack. By nightfall, the Eagle battalion occupying Opheusden, focal point of the German effort for three days of fanatical fighting, withdrew to a defensive line east of the town.

Opheusden changed hands several times. Either attacking or withdrawing, skillful Eagle sky-fighters inflicted tremendous losses on the 363rd Div. now completely assembled with the 959th Inf. Regt. 363rd Art. Regt. and its engineer and fusilier battalions in the fold. Airborne soldiers eventually captured the town, blasted retreating and thoroughly beaten Germans completely out of the Airborne sector.

Order of Battle records of enemy killed, wounded and captured provide mute testimony to the destruction of the German division. In its reorganized Volksgrenadier status, the once-proud 363rd Inf. Div. lasted exactly 10 days in the claws of the Screaming Eagles.

From then on, activity in Holland was limited to patrols. \*\*\*\*\*
