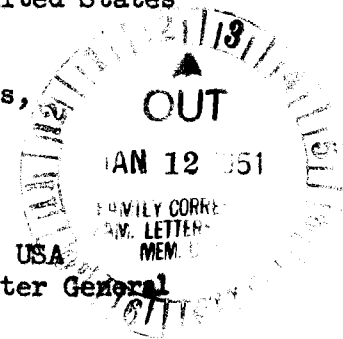
This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

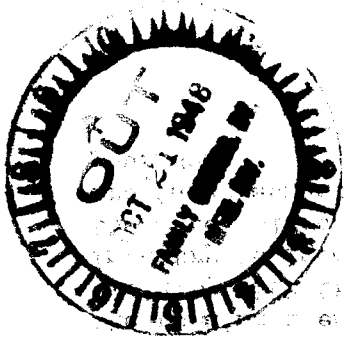
Our office promised to communicate with you further upon receipt of information concerning your son, the late Sergeant Donald R. Starr.

At this time I may inform you that the official report of burial discloses that his remains were originally buried in an isolated grave in Keikberg Forest, Holland, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel and moved to a more suitable location. His remains have been properly identified as a result of a subsequent investigation and I am, therefore, gratified to inform you the report discloses further that the remains of your son are now resting in Plot DD, Row 10, Grave 242, in the United States Military Cemetery Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium.

This cemetery is located nine miles southwest of Liege, Belgium, and is under the constant care and supervision of our government and, you may be interested to know, has been designated as a permanent American Military Cemetery dedicated in grateful remembrance of our World War II Dead.

Our records reveal that the identification of the remains of your son was established by the favorable comparison of tooth charts made for the deceased with those maintained in Army dental records for your son. Comparison was also made of physical characteristics with favorable results. His identification is further substantiated by the type of clothing found on the remains which is in agreement with the branch of service to which your son was assigned. Furthermore, the paratroopers boots, size 10B, which were found on the deceased are in agreement with your son's branch of service and with his shoe size as shown in Army records. Then, too, the remains identified as those of your son were disinterred from the same cemetery with the identified remains of another member of the 401st Glider Infantry Regiment, the regiment of which your son was a member. In addition, the date, place and cause of death, as given on the official report of death, are in agreement with the records of the Office of The Adjutant General for your son.

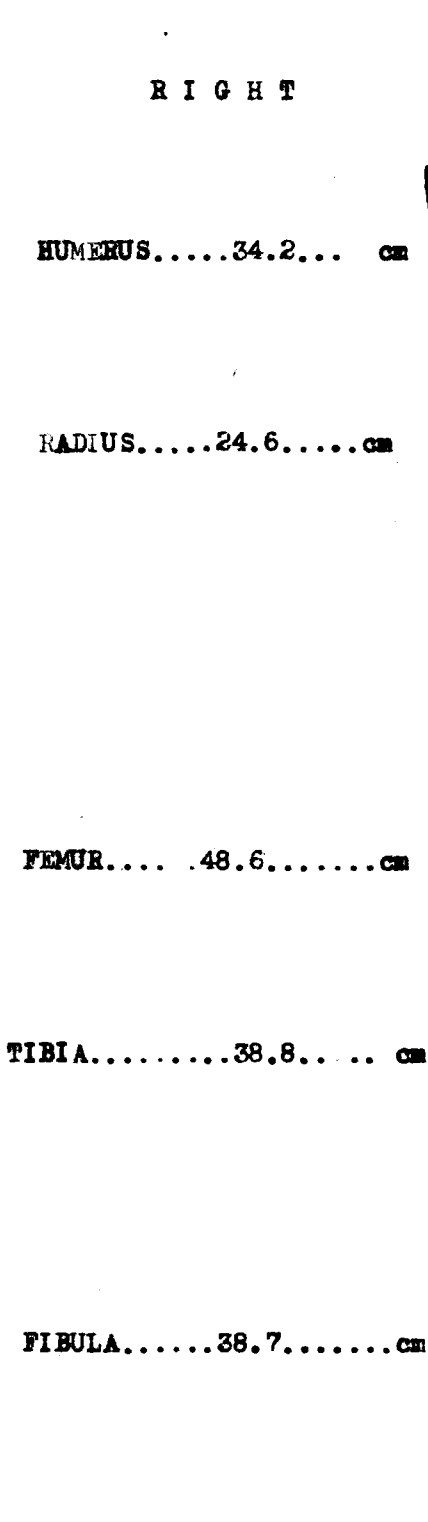

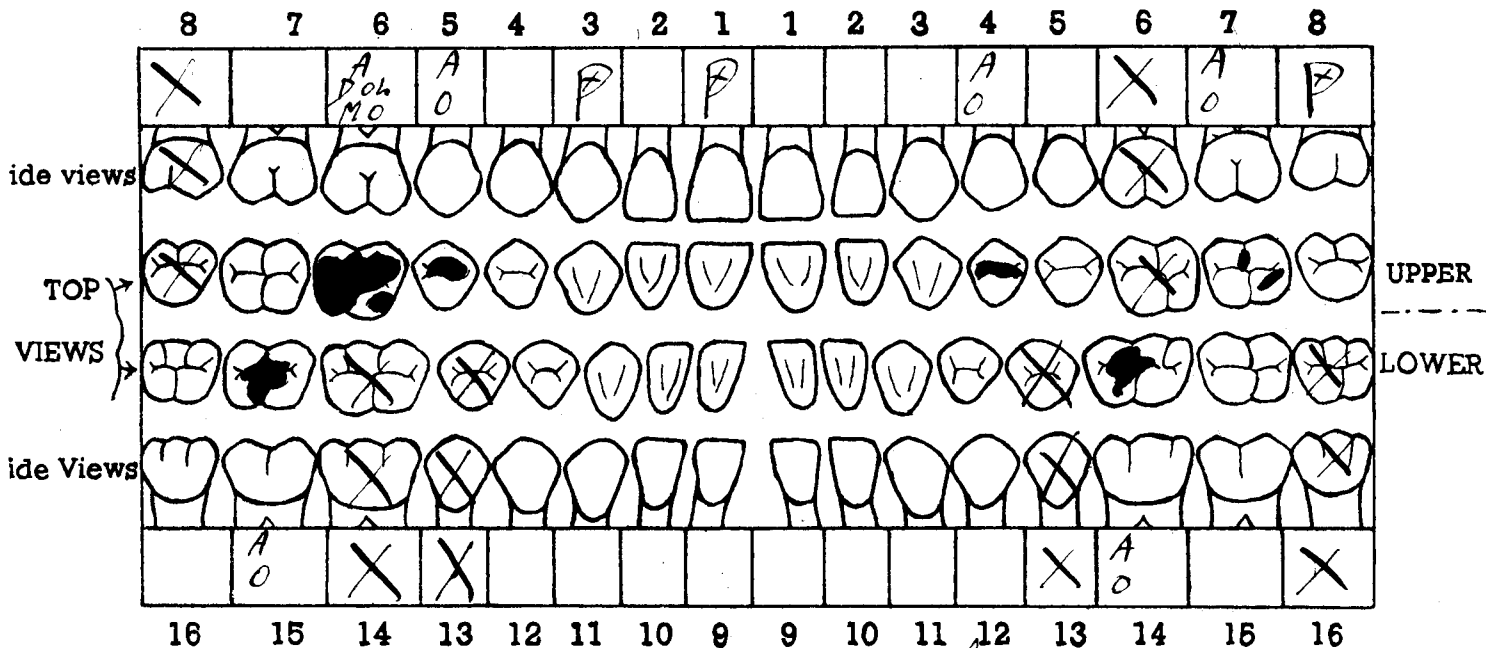

Disinterment of two (2) bodies at Mook-Middelaar area in the Koningsbosch forest, proved to be two (2) paratroopers.

The first remains which were disinterred consisted of a complete disarticulated body. Found with these remains was a comb, toothbrush, three (3) English coins and a pen knife. Clothing consisted of O.D. uniform, pieces of cotton underwear, pieces of field jacket, and also helmet liner and paratrooper boots. Head and teeth present. No flesh on this body. These remains were evacuated to C.I.P. under evacuation number IZ - 1451.

The second remains which were disinterred and evacuated to C.I.P. under evacuation number IZ-1452 consisted of a complete disarticulated body, with head and teeth present. Also found with remains was a U.S. Army whistle, cartridge, belt, pieces of O.D. uniform, pieces of field jacket and paratrooper boots, also a silk (piece of green parachute) scarf and cotton underwear. These remains seemed to have been given first aid for aid bandages were found to have been in and around the chest and stomach area amidst the bones. No flesh found with these remains.

It is believed that the two (2) unknowns mentioned in case were killed approximately September or October 1944, which is the time of the battle in this area.

Both graves have been thoroughly searched by me, and also the surrounding areas. Both these graves have been found in wooded area, and were found by forest workers while digging holes for replanting of other trees.
