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

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

Your letter of recent date has been forwarded to this office for necessary action in connection with the personal effects and burial of your son, the late Private Llywllyn G. Forney.

It may be of some comfort to you to know that the remains of your son were reverently and properly interred in one of our well established United States Military Cemeteries in the area in which he was serving, with a Protestant ceremony conducted at the grave by an Army Chaplain. The cemetery is well cared for and under immediate supervision of our military authorities. A temporary marker, with a fitting inscription thereon, has been erected, and the grave properly recorded. Due to security regulations the geographical location cannot be disclosed at this time.

A copy of your letter has been forwarded to the Effects Quartermaster, Army Effects Bureau, Kansas City Quartermaster Depot, 601 Hardesty Avenue, Kansas City 1, Missouri, for reply to you. That office has jurisdiction over the disposal of the personal effects of our military personnel outside the United States. However, considerable time is often recessary to process these personal belongings back to this country due to the lack of shipping space and the great amount of work involved.

Could you possibly tell me how my son was killed and where his body is buried. He was a full fleged Paratrooper and was in the 82nd Airborne Division. A.P.O. #469.

It seems very strange to me that I haven't received his personal belongings and been notified where he was buried as a Mrs. John Kick of Port Byron, New York whose son was also a Paratrooper was in the same company and same regiment as my boy and he too was killed on October 10, 1943. She has received his personal belongings and been notified where her son was buried.

If you could please let me know where he is buried so that maybe some day after the war I could go to the place where my son is buried.

Please answer these questions if you can and I will be very thankful. Let me hear from you as soon as you can.

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

- PREPARATION OF BODY: Have body examined by member of Medical Department whenever possible (to attach E.M.T. Form 52b.) Remove all personal property; remove one identification tag, leave other on body in protected position (in case of enemy dead, leave 1/2 tag on body, forward 1/2 with personal effects). If no tag present, make notation of identifying data on form, protect in sealed bottle, canteen, spent shell, or best available container, and bury with remains. If unidentified, take fingerprints of both hands; if this is not possible fill out tooth-chart and note height, weight, color of eyes and hair, tattoo marks, birthmarks, etc., and other data as serial no of weapon, laundry marks, where body found, etc. Wrap body in shelter half, mattress cover, or blanket when available.
- BURIAL: Dig grave to a depth of five feet (hasty battlefield burials, to sufficient depth to prevent elements from exposing the body). Place only one body in a grave. Dig graves side by side, row behind row.
- 3. MARKING OF GRAVE: Fasten identification tag to temporary name peg and place at head of grave. For enemy dead, write data on peg. When pegs are not available, copy data on a piece of paper, place in bottle, spent shell, or other receptacle, seal tightly and place so as to mark and identify grave. If identification tag cannot be fastened to peg or placed in container, do not leave at grave but forward with report of burial. If only one tag is found on body, it should be buried with body. The information thereon should be written on marker or placed in container at head of grave. Do not use weapons or helmets to mark graves.
- 4. LOCATION OF GRAVE: Report burials in established cemeteries by plot, row, and grave number (or show on cemetery map). For all other burials prepare sketch in space provided below; and give location by means of map references, or by reference to prominent permanent landmarks. Information must be specific, accurate, complete. Stand at foot of grave facing head to determine bodies buried to the left and right.
- 5. PERSONAL EFFECTS: List only personal effects taken from body on the Burial Report form, Place these with information as to identity of owner, organization, emergency addressee, in personal effects bag, or wrap in handkerchief, towel, or other available material, and turn over to Graves Registration Service Personnel with report of burial. 



If unidentified, take fingerprints of both hands; if this not possible, fill out tooth-chart and note heigt, weight, color of eyes and hair tattoo marks, birthmarks, etc..., and other data as serial no. of weapon, laundry marks, where bodyfound, etc. Wrap body in shelter half, mattress cover, or blanket when available.
- 2. BURIAL: Dig grave to a depth five feet hasty battlefield burials, to sufficient depth to prevent elements from exposing the body.) Place only one body in a grave. Dig graves side by side, row behind row.

Your letter of recent date has been forwarded to this office for necessary action in connection with the personal effects and burial of your son, the late Private Llywllyn G. Forney.

It may be of some comfort to you to know that the remains of your son were reverently and properly interred in one of our well established United States Military Cemeteries in the area in which he was serving, with a Protestant ceremony conducted at the grave by an Army Chaplain. The cemetery is well cared for and under immediate supervision of our military authorities. A temporary marker, with a fitting inscription thereon, has been erected, and the grave properly recorded. Due to security regulations the geographical location cannot be disclosed at this time.

A copy of your letter has been forwarded to the Effects Quartermaster, Army Effects Bureau, Kansas City Quartermaster Depot, 601 Hardesty Avenue, Kansas City 1, Missouri, for reply to you. That office has jurisdiction over the disposal of the personal effects of our military personnel outside the United States. However, considerable time is often mecessary to process these personal belongings back to this country due to the lack of shipping space and the great amount of work involved.

Please accept my sincere sympathy and condolence in the loss of your son.
