

Cowan, Visseulle and Alhoumont. C.P. spent the night at Alhoumont and the next day the attack was continued and Gatteru, Chateau Liheraine, Steinbach and Limerle fell to our arms. The regimental C.P. was set up at Limerle with the battalions disposed, 2nd on the right, 1st on the left and 3rd in reserve with front lines generally from Halt 708740 through 715755 to 713763. On arrival at Limerle the town was subject to intense enemy artillery fire for some hours after occupations. That evening Major Creek commander of the third battalion stepped on an anti-personnel mine which resulted in his evacuation.
