Dear Mrs. Davis:

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. If you are the next of kin according to the line of kinship as set forth in the enclosed pamphlet, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," you are invited to express your wishes as to the disposition of the remains of the deceased by completing Part I of the enclosed form "Request for Disposition of Remains." Should you desire to relinquish your rights to the next in line of kinship, please complete Part II of the enclosed form. If you are not the next of kin, please complete Part III of the enclosed form.

If you should elect Option 2, it is advised that no funeral arrangements or other personal arrangements be made until you are further notified by this office.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.



The Army Effects Bureau has received from abroad additional personal effects of your son, 1st Lt. George C. Davis. An itemized list of the property is attached.

You will observe that among other listed articles are some underwear, socks, towels, or similar items possessing little intrinsic or sentimental value. For some time we have been puzzled about just what should be done with such articles. Some families have been sharply critical of us for forwarding them. At present, it is our policy to forward all items which we receive.

We would like you to indicate, by crossing out on the inclosed list, any items which you do not want to receive. This request is made to ascertain the attitude of the families of casualties, for our guidance in deciding whether articles without actual or sentimental value shall be extracted. Any items extracted will be sent to relief and charitable organizations.

In writing you and some one hundred others, as representative American families, we seek to procure a cross-section opinion in order that our policy will accord with the majority viewpoint.

Please be entirely candid in your response to this inquiry and make any written comment you desire on the reverse side of the inclosed list; it will be treated confidentially. I dislike touching upon this subject but I know of no other way to get representative opinions. Your cooperation and remarks on this subject will be deeply appreciated. For your reply, I inclose an addressed envelope which needs no postage.

I regret exceedingly the unhappy and tragic circumstances occasioning this correspondence and to you and your family I extend my every sympathy.
