
#### EXPLANATION OF PART A - CIVILIAN OR PRIVATE CEMETERY

- 1. When the remains are delivered for interment in a civilian or private cemetery, you are responsible for paying all interment expenses. In this connection, you are entitled to the allowance mentioned in paragraph 2 below.
- 2. An amount not to exceed \$75 is allowed by the government toward actual interment expenses when final interment of the remains is in a private or civilian cemetery. No allowance is authorized toward interment expenses when interment is in a national or post cemetery.
- 3. The 375 maximum allowance by the government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.
- 4. Reimburgement by the government is made only to the person who paid from his personal funds the expenses of or incident to interment in a private or civilian cemetery. Receipted bills are not required to accompany this form. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.

#### EXPLANATION OF PART B - NATIONAL OR POST CEMETERY

- 1. When the remains are delivered to you at government expense prior to burial in a national or post cemetery, you are responsible for all additional expenses necessary to deliver the remains from that point to the national or post cemetery grave site. However, you may be entitled to an allowance for the cost of transporting the remains from your home to the national or post cemetery grave site subject to the conditions outlined in paragraph 2. whelfold
- 2: Reimbursement of transportation expenses is allowed only when the cost to the government to deliver the remains to you is LESS than what it would have cost the government to deliver the remains direct to the national or post cemetery of final interment. However, the amount which you may be allowed (the difference between cost of delivery to you and cost of delivery the government direct to the national or post cemetery) may not exceed the amount actually expended by you to deliver the remains to the cemetery grave site. 

Reference is made to your inquiry addressed to Hajor General J. A. Ulio, The Adjutant General's Office, War Department, Washington, D. C., and forwarded here for reply to such part of the communication as pertains to this office, in behalf of Er. and Ers. James Maltby, who desire information regarding the burial and return of remains, as well as the personal effects, of their son, Private Thomas E. Maltby, 36433332, who was killed in France on 8 July 1944.

Mr. and Mrs. Malthy should be informed that the records of this office indicate that the remains of Private Malthy were temporarily interred in the area in which he was serving; it is regretted that, due to security regulations, the exact location cannot be disclosed at this time. They may be assured, however, that their son was buried with the utmost respect and reverence, with appropriate services conducted at the grave by an Aray Chaplain.

However, it is contemplated returning the remains of all American dead after cessation of hostilities; The Quartermaster General will communicate with the next of kin at the proper time to ascertain the final shipping instructions. Steps will be taken at that time to carry out their wishes, if possible, and all expenses pertaining to the preparation of the remains, casketing and shipment to the place thus designated will be borne by the Government.
