STATEMENT OF 1st Lt WALTER E. STARK, 0518967, CONCERNING AC NO. 42-93002.

I was pilot of C 53D, AC No. 42-68721, flying right wing position on C 47A, AC No. 42-93002 flown by Capt Cartwright and Flt O Magleby.

As we passed the Drop Zone, Capt Cartwright was putting his plane through violent evasive action. Machine gun fire from ground positions was moderate.

The paratroops from my plane jumped but I did not see troops leave Capt Cartwright's plane.

About one half minute after the troops left my plane I saw Capt Cartwright's plane go into an abrupt diving right hand turn.

It is my belief that Capt Cartwright's troops did not drop while over the Drop Zone and that he was making a 360° turn to the right to pass over the Drop Zone a second time to allow his troops to jump. This 360° turn would have been in conformity with Mission briefing instructions.

The last I saw of Capt Cartwright's plane was as it went into the diving right hand turn.

STATEMENT OF 2D LT WILLIAM C. MORGAN, 0687258, CONCERNING AC NO. 42-93002.

I was flying as co-pilot of C 53D, AC No. 42-68721 in the right wing position to the plane flown by Capt Cartwright.

As we approached the drop zone our flight received machine gun fire from the ground. Immediately Capt Cartwright's plane and our plane took evasive action.

Over the drop zone we dropped our load of paratroops but so far as I could see, paratroops did not jump from Capt Cartwright's plane.

After dropping our paratroops we continued flying in the right wing position to Capt Cartwright. He made a turn to the right and we followed him for 90° of a turn, when we discovered he intended making a 180° turn or more for another approach to the drop zone.

His turn seemed normal and the ship was functioning normally although it was receiving severe machine gun fire from the ground.

That was the last I saw of Capt Cartwright's plane.

No search for missing aircraft was made.


On a re-supply mission flown 7 June 1944, one crew reported seeing a C 47 with its tail damaged, sitting in mud flats approximately 13 miles north-east of Etienville. Crew also reported the tail of this plane bore the letter "S", this letter being the same as that painted on C 47A No. 42-93002. It is reported that the plane was in good condition. The only damage appearing to be in the tail. In this case, it is felt personnel may have survived.

Whether or not paratroops were dropped from this plane is unknown.

SUBJECT: Supplement to Missing Air Crew Report.

TO : Commanding Officer, 314th Troop Carrier Group, AAF, APO 133, US Army.

1. Reference, Missing Air Crew Report, 62nd Troop Carrier Squadron, 314th Troop Carrier Group, AAF, 7 June 1944, accomplished on C-47A AAF Serial No. 42-93002, the following supplemental information is submitted for completion of necessary records:

a. Personnel.

- A. Pilot- CARTWRIGHT, CHARLES S., Capt, O-731943, from MIA to RTD
- B. Co-Pilot- MAGLEBY, ALMA M., Flt O, T-926, from MIA to RTD
- C. Navigator- OSBORNE, EDWARD I., 2nd Lt, O-805327 from MIA to LWA
- D. Crew Chief- Farris, Raymond H., S/Sgt, 15114703 from MIA to RTD
- E. Radio Operator- DeLuca, Frank A., S/Sgt, 32453728 from MIA to RTD

b. Cause of Missing Aircraft.

- A. Plane made three approaches to designated Drop Zone, necessitated by failure of paratroopers to jump at proper time. On the third approach to DZ, both engines failed and the ship started burning as a direct result of enemy ground machine-gun fire.
- B. When engines failed all paratroops jumped from the plane with exception of one paratrooper who was seriously wounded when two grenades exploded in his pocket. Captain Cartwright and Flt O Magleby managed to land the disabled plane and remove the wounded paratrooper before the entire plane was afire. Name of wounded paratrooper is unknown.
- C. S/Sgt Farris and S/Sgt DeLuca received multiple lacerations of the face and legs in the crash landing. These injuries necessitated medical treatment. While making their way from the scene of the landing to the beach-head on 7 June 1944, Lt Osborne was slightly wounded in the buttock by a rifle bullet.

D. Lt Osborne was left on the beach-head under the care of Medical Corps personnel.

E. Capt Cartwright, Flt O Magleby, S/Sgt DeLuca and S/Sgt Farris were carried by a U.S. Navy LCVI from France to Southampton. From Southampton they were flown to Saltby Air Base, Salby, Lincolnshire, England where they rejoined this unit at 2230 hours 10 June 1944.

F. Mission was accomplished, all para-packs seventeen (17) out of eighteen (18) paratroop were dropped at DZ.

G. Aircraft was totally destroyed by fire.
