

STATEMENT

1 July 1944

I, F/O John E. Beale, T-726, 71st T.C. Sq. 434th T.C. Gp, do hereby state that on 10 June 1944 I saw F/O John C. Ballintine, T-60701 of the 71st T.C. Sq. 434th T.C. Gp. on returning boat while being evacuated. He told me he had been shot above one eye, a grazing wound. He had a bandage over his eye. He also told me he had two fingers shot of f by a machine pistel.

He told me that he saw r/O William (NMI) Jew, T-798, F/O Steve P. Cdahowski, T-1296 and r/O Alfred J. Sapa, T-468 all of the 71st T.C. sq. 434th T.C. Gp. taken prisoners and marched away by Germans.

I have not seen F/O John C. Ballintine, T-60701, 71st T.C. Sq. 434th T.C. Gp. since.

STATEMENT

I, JOHN C BALLINTINE, F/O, T-60701, 71st T C Sq, 434th T C Gp, do hereby state that I was in the second lift of the Neptune-

Bigot operation on the afternoon of 6 June 1944.

I was the co-pilot for ALFRED J SAPA, F/O, T-468, 71st T C We were in #10 glider in the left element. After cutoff we made a good landing. The gear was washed out but everyone got out of the glider without injury. We were under enemy fire from the time we got onto the field, both mortar and small arms fire.

Sapa and I got right out of the glider and hit the ground. The airborne troops also got out and hit the dirt. After I had determined the direction of enemy fire I told the men to follow meover to a hedgerow about 30 yards away. Only two followed me.

Everyone else, including F/O Sapa stayed bythe glider.

About 45 minutes later a platoon of Germans charged the field. The three of us in the heagerow started picking off as many as we could. One of the airborne soldiers with me had a tommy gun, but an enemy bullet caught the gun and tore it up. Shortly after that everything went blank for me. I came to on the field with a German medic dressing my head. A bullet had mangled the fingers of my right hand and imbedded itself in my left forehead. The German medic was armed with a rifle.

I was taken back to a forward dressing station in St.Comedu-Mont by the Ger ans. While at the aid station we were shelled and bombedby the Allies. The town was really torn up. The Germans pulled out, abandoning their medics and wounded, both American and German. I was stripped of all my own equipment and lost everything but a pict re folio which had nothing of value in it. Even our gas masks were taken away from us.

After I left the glider I did not see F/O Sapa again, I do

not know what happened to him.

STATEMENT

I, ROBERT CROFT, F/O, T-123375, 75th T C Sq, 435th T C Gp, do hereby sta e that I participated in the second lift, Neptune-Bigot operation on the afternoon of 6 June 1944 and was attached to the 71st T C Squadron, 434th T C Gp for such operation.

I was co-pilot for GUS T GRIFFIN, 2d Lt, 075th T C Sq, 435th T C Gp. We landed o.k. Two of the airborne soldiers in our glider were hit before landing. We hit the ground and tried to crawl to cover, but both Griffin and myself were hit before reaching cover. I received seven flesh wounds, a broken left elbow, severe wounds of the left leg. I coulan't move but Griffin tried to move on and got hit. I feel sure he was killed.

I was captured about 2200 6 June 1944 and treated by German medics on the field. At the same time that I was being treated the Germans were gathering captives on the same field, those that were uninjured were marched away. I saw F/O William Jew, T-798, 71st T C Sq and F/O Steve P O dahowski, T-1296,71st T C Sq among the captives being marched away and yelled at them, they nodded to me. I did not see them again.

The German medic who treated me was armed with a German Lueger

pistol.

I do not know F/O Alfred J. Sapa, T-468, 71st T C Sq, and I cannot say for sure whether or not he was among the captives.
