

## RECORD OF ACTION ON SGT GABRIELSON, PRC DOBSON, \& PVT CLANGY

Sgt Gabrielson, Pfc Dobson, and Put Clancy landed in St SAUVEUR LE VICOMTE, one landing on a house. Clancy and Dobson got together the first night, and Sgt Gabrielson joined them after two days. All roads were being heavily used, and many troops were moving into St SAUVEUR LE VICUMTE. There were many bivouacs around the town, and it was being bombed heavily by Allied planes. On Tuesday our planes failed to hit the bridge, but on Wednesday they succeeded in demolishing it. The Germans worked on the bombed bridge Thursday, but our planes again hit it again on Friday. This bridge is across the DOUVE RIVER East of town.

There are antiaircraft guns on knolls to the South of the town. No troops were South of the Prairie. The Germans had very fow trucks and were using wagons which our planes were not strafing. There were some half tracks and light tanks in the town, and there are four (4) 72 mm guns at (2691). While we were staying there in town man at the Post Office tookcare of us.

72 men were ferried across DOUVE RIVER to the North by Frenchmen. One of the men was Col MENDEZ.

One of our planes crashed at (2491) - tail number was 2101025. It was burned and all men were killed. One of the wallets had the name Jacobs and the number 508 in it. There are 20 parachutists in towns at RAUVILLE (2095) in 2 house. Also there are from ten to welve ( 10 to 12) men in VINDEFONTAINE. No Germans are in the latter place.

There were no Germans in BOIS DE LIMORS until the 13 th for our men were there. A patrol came across DOUVE RIVER from LA MARE DE RAUVILIE (2293) in rubber boats at dark and stay until the next night at dark.

At ST SAUVEUR the Germans have some of our equipment bundles and are testing our pifles on a rifle range there.

After being forced out of ST SAUVEUR LE VICOMTE by Allied bombing we moved across the Prairies to BOIS DE LIMORS. Then wetraveled across country to around the vicinity of ETIENVILLE, where we ment an American patrol. Then we reported to our unit at 1700 June 14 th.

CAPT AIN JOHNSON:
I landed about one mile fest of GUEUTTEVILIS on June 6. Joined with Lt. McVickere of 2nd $\mathrm{Bn}, 508$ Inf and moved into position ge of GuTTEVILIE on high ground. I attempted to contact my 00 the remainder of the day on 300 Radio. Was joined by Major Warren of lat $\mathrm{Bn}, 508 \mathrm{Inf}$ and went under his commend. Contacted Lt. Col. Schenley, 00 of 2nd $B n, 508$ Inf and was instructed to join him at (307936) about 2050 on D day. At 2330 we advanced and took HULL \#30 located at (311942). We reorganized and went into an all-round defensive position. I stayed there until 1930 on $D \not \& 3$ at which time I Was relieved and returned to Division to report in. Reported to Bn at 0630 on $\mathrm{D} \neq 4$.

## LT WHALEN:

I landed on the East bank of the DOUVE RIVER in the SE edge of SI SOUVEUR Le VICOMTE, Swam the DOUVE RIVER to we st bank and tried to get into town to locate main body of troops, was unable to get there due to MG emplacementa. I retired to high ground $S$ of ST SOUVEUR Le VICOMTE and gtayed there until 2400 D day. Then I recrosed the DOUVE RIVER at (215935) and proceeded NE the balance of night. Hitting REIGNVILIE in the morning of $D \nmid 1$ at 1000. Then turned E and crossing main road $S$ of ORGLANDES, noticed German Hdqra there and heavy traffic. The road was patrolled by acout car e and half tracks. I cut communication lines $S$ of ORGLANDES then moved $S$ stopping about a mile NW of PICAUVILIE, and cut communication line a. Then proceeded toward $\operatorname{PICAUVILIE\text {.Contactedtheenemyandthenmovedtowarda}}$ ETENVILIE. Noticed heavy German artillery concentration mile we st of PIOAUVILLE. Stayed in the vicinity of PTOAUVILIE $D \not \subset 2$ and $D \nmid 3$. While there, noticed heavy Germen concentration about a mile $\mathbb{E}$ of there. On $D \not 44$ moved East toward the MERDERET RIVER and contacted american troope at 1500 st of river. Feported to Diviaion and then to Bn .

On the morning of 6 June $0 p b$ Borges and Pvt steveng $c$ ame in with the $P$ ir st wave. Due to chutes opened up we did not jump, and went back with the plane. On the morning of 7 June at 0630 epl Borgas \& Pvt Stevens came in With the resupplies and were dropped in the vicinity of PICAUVILLE in an orchard, landing in trees. Six other paratroopers from the 505 were dropped there, all have been killed, two being atrung up in trees by the Cermans. Cpl Borges and Pvt Stevens were aurrounded at this gpot with WG and gnipers for four days. All they had were $\frac{\pi}{\prime} \mathrm{D}$ rations each and $1 / 2$ canteen of water. After water was gone they collected the dew from the orusin with their handmerchiefs and. wet their lips. Besides be ing surrounded by the enemy we also nad srtillery ghells bur sting all around.

On 9 June two cermens came down the road with a MG and trigod, came into the orchard and bet up the gun 8 ft away from the ditch we were in. The germans sat there and ate \& amoked. After being there for about twenty minute a they moved out. During cur time there we tried to get away one time, but found themewnego use trying ao we came back in end stajed teere until the morning of 11 June at 0900 when the 90 th Div pushed through and we got out with safety. We were too wesk to get along so they took us to their OP and kept us there and fed use bater on in the day they returned us to our unit.

## RECORD OF ACTION ON LT CAPPA, CO "B"

Dropping at approximately 0208 on D-Day I landed near the center of ST SAUVEUR LE VICOMTE. Failing to find any of my atick before daylight I was forced to hide. With the help of the kind French my chute was buried and I hid in the upstairs of a bicycle shop. They fed me for about five days until they evacuated the town. Groups of the enemy were alweys in my vicinity making it difficult to leave the town. I remained in the town until the Americans crossed the DOUVE RIVER. The altitude we jumped from seemed high (arcund 600 ft ) and we were fired upon coming down. Enemy activity in the town was mach without heavy amor. The troops did not seem first line. French counted 153 paratroopers prisoners brought through the town.

## RECORD OF ACTION ON S SGT WATTERS, PVT KING, PVT ZWIR, \& PVT PETERSEN

S/Sgt Watters made a parachute juip on D Day landing across the DOUVE RIVER North east of ST SAUVEUR IE VICOMTB. Sgt Watters and Pvt Zwir stayed in this area from 6 June to 13 June. During this time they were surrounded by Germans. They made one attempt to go Morth, but ran into a machingun emplacement and well fortified positions. Upon knowing this they decided to go back to their positions again. All this time they saw German troops maneuvering back and forth, also seeing 2 thirty-car troop train coming in from the North. These troops were unloaded in this area. On the fifth and sixth day our planes bombed the town of ST SAUVEUR I VICOMTE which led us to think the Germans had lefthe town。 Sgt Watters and Pvt Zwir decided to cross the river and enter the tom. They were brought across the river by five French civilians. After crossing the river they saw the Germans retreating toward the DOUVE RIVER, which led us to believe our troops were comin! through. We then stayed at this point until our troops arrived. We were then picked up by the 505 th CT and sent to Div CP. En route to Div CP we picked up Prt King and Put Potersen, who were staying in an area cl ose by.

Pvt King reports on or about the third day of his stay in this area, which was North of ETIENVILIE. About fifty American paratroopers were marched by under heavy German guards. The civilians eeported these troopers were being marched $t$ VALOGNES.

## REOCRD OF ACTION ON PVI BISHOF, CO "B".

Pfc Bishop states on the morning of 6 June at 0200 he made a prcht jump and landed near PICAUVILIE, FRANCE. He landed in enemy territory and was surrounded by German MG emplanements and small arms fire. He stayed in this area until 1100 the next day. At 1100 June 7th Pfc Bishop was captured by 3 Germans who took him to a German Hq. Here he rendered assistance to American and German personnel. Later this day he was taken to a German Hospital 2 kilometers NW of ORGIANDES. At this hospital Pfc Bishop states the Germans left the Americans first aidmen take care of their own patients. Pfe Bishop also states that our wounded have been treated very well by the Germans. He was at this hospital until 16 June at which time the Americans captured the hospital. At 1500 Pfc Bishop returned to his unit, on 17 June.

At 00045 Sgt Robinson and his squad plus four men from third squad took one company of 508 Preht Inf across DOUVE RIVER in an assault on BEUZEVILLE LA BASTILIE using eight assault boats. This was done with the assistance of a French guide. The crossing was successful and the 508 was in position without 2 shot being fired. While this was being done the rest of Co "A" stood by with assault boats to ferry the rest of the troops across in the event the foot bridge the engineers have been putting in would have failed.

## RECORD OF ACTION OF LT KLEIN \& DETAIL

It Klein and 38 EM ataached to and Bn 508 Preht Inf. Left Bn 2000 June 13. Joined 508 Prcht inf at 2100 , crossed DOUVE RIVER 0500 and moved up in column with 508 to a point one (1) mile and a hlaf South of BEUZEVILIE LA BASTILLE. Encountered a Mark III and a French light tank. Bn knocked these tanks out, then with out any resistance moved Scuth to a position approximately $1 / 2$ mile North of LAUNAY. Then went into a poaition prior to attack. and Bn launched attack at 1700 and drove the enemy to the outskirts of BAUPTE and spent the evening mopping up the snipers in this area.

Morning of the 14th Sgt Lajoie and a detail of seven men prepared bridge at (315851), This bridge was not blown.

In the afternoon a detail of men under S/Sgt Bolmowski destroyed a culvert at (293859). At the same time a detail under Cpl Gaskey and Cpl Borges destroyed railroad bridge at (295851).

One platoon of infantry from the 508 provided security in order to accomplish this mission.

It Klein and his detail were relieved from the 508 at 2300 June 14 o Returned to unit.

GRCORD OF ACTION OF IT KUETH, $C 0$ "B"
(From 2nd July to 7th July)
The ovening of 2 July 1944 at 2200 It Mlain am two squads loft marea and attached to 50sth Inf. Opom arrival It Kloin was given the mission of clearinc roads and shoulders of mines and booby traps in 508 sector, At this time Lt Elein asaigned Sgt Reckembech and his squad to 2nd in 500 Inf , and asacnod Set stmathajo and his sqgad to 3 thin 508 Inf. At 0630 July 3 rd these two squade moved out and mopt roads for mines and beoby traps, wich made it possible for the tanks to adrance. This work was done umier contimane heary amall aris and mortar ifre. Total camaltien was mine men, three wounded by shrapal of sines, and aix woumed by shells and mortar fire. At 2000 Lt Klein and his two aquads mere assigned a mission with Ce C, 50 Inf, to sweep for minos. This nisaion was completed at 0100 July hth at which time they weat inte bivouac for the aipht.

At 0600 July 4th Lt Klain and his mon atartod to smeep for mines in the 508 sector. This was done throughout the day mader heary amall arma fire. Mmy mines were found. At 0y00 Lt Whalon and one equad of Ce Buder 3gt beckey loft marea and joised It Moin with 508 Inf.

It 0600 July 5th It Klein and platom started swooping for mines until 1700 this date at which timo 62 anony fellor mines have beem found and romored.

At 6600 July 6th It Whalow and his squad mador Sgt Gaskey swopt for mines until 1200. This was deas mader hoary sanll arms and mortar fire. The miselem was suecessifully completed and mado it possible for the tanks to adrance. At 1200 thece squalis were relioved ad put into regimotal reserve. They then swopt for mines in the 508 area.

The morning of July 7th at 1000 all missicas wore ccmpleted and the squads returned to 307 Ragrs CP.

RECORD OF ACTICN OF LT FINLAYSON, $C O$ ME
(Statement by Sct Geskey)
( July 2nd to July 7th).
The eveaing of July 2, 1944 at 1745 It Finiayson and one aquad umior Set Gaskey left in arez and attached to 50 Inf. It Finlaysom hal a niesien assigned to him of clearing reads and shouldors of minos and booby trape.

The morning of July 3ri at 0630 It Finlaysen toek part of a squad with mine cetectors and Sgt Geakey followod with the rest of the squad with mangalore torpedcel to blow hodses if so required. This squad swopt for mince in the 507 seetor under contimous heavy amall arms and mortar fire. Mission was completed and made it possible for the tanks to adrance. At 0900 Cpl Doaske was wouded in leg by machine pistol. Squad contimach to areep for mines until 1200 at which tim Put OMPolil tac

## RISCORD OF ACTIGN OF LT CAPPA, CO "B" (Frow July and to July 5th)

Oa the eftermeen of 2 July 1944 at 1400 Lt Cappa asd his platoen left Ba area and attached to 505 Inf . Opom arrival at 505 Inf It Cappa was assigned the miseice of awoeping roade for mines and elearing obetaeles to VARraNQUEBEC, FRARCE. A this time It Cappa aesignod Cpl Saith and 3 mon to CO B, 505 Inf, to meutralise bridge already preparod for demolitiom, also sweep for mines. With infactry support they completed their missim.

At 0600 It Cappa and his plation left to sweep roade in the 505 sector. lit 0730 It Cappa's jeep with supplios was hit and blem up by som shell. This deleyed the movement until 1300 at which timo it Cappe roceived a recepply from the rear ases This was done under heavy shell fire. Ho one was hurt during the incidont. At 1430 It Cappa and his platone reached VARTwQuBrec. This was done mider conotant shojling. From varga quEisc the platoon mont Northweat and ewert for inimes wantil 1700. At 1900 the platoon precooded to contime to oweep for mines Fist on the Northwost road unti: 2215. Then moved into bivevace for the aight.

At 0400 July hth Lt Cappa dnd his platoon moved out attached to let ma of 505 for an attack Senth. This missiom wes to syeep roads which atasted at 0845 sollewin the attaek. 0930 It Cppa and his platoon returned to ha CP after being turned baek by mall arms and hoary astillery fire. At 1030 the pleteon attempted this miesion once more. Misalion completed this time up to the point where roade were unpassable. At this point the platoom ron into artillery fire causing ome easualty. Miesion wea conpleted and the platoon roturned to bivcuac aroa.

At 1250 July 5 th the plation was relieved ir 505 Inf and returned to 307 Eagr $C$

RECORD OF ACTION OF LT ERL, 2ND ELATOON, CO "A"
(From July 3rd to July 7th)
On the morning of 3 July 1944 at 0510 It Erl and his platoon of Co A left Bn area and attached to 325 Inf. This platoon was given a mission of clearing roads of mines and booby traps. Cleared 4000 yards of roads from IA DRANGUBRIE to IA POTERIE, FRANCE. The roads were heavily mined in this sector. Eight road blocks were found with the average of eight Teller mines \#2 and \#3 in each. These road blocks were removed under heavy mortar and arililery fire. This platoon was continuously ahead of the supporting tanks with mine detectors which drew a considerable amount of fire.

At about 1030 while moving North on Road (4) at (252878) LA HAY DU PUITS, the platoon reached a pocket of resistance, and after putting up a strong fight was able to continue on the job of sweeping the roads formines, having captured (2) prisoners. Due to the aggressiveness of the platoon the tanks were able to keep abreast of the infantry advance. During this mission the Second Platoon had three casualties: Tec 5 Oehmke, who was hit with shrapnel in the eye; Pvt Welch who was hit by enemy machine gun; and Put McAdams who was hit in the leg with shrapnel. second platoon also reports the removal of booby traps out of tuegetable gardens which was one of the Germans tricks. Also many charges have been removed from trees which were ready to be blown across road. Had this been done it would have delayed the advance one full day.

The Second Platoon was relieved 4 July 1700 by one squad of First Platoon under It MeDermott and Sgt Harris who continued on with same mission of clearing roads of mines and booby traps. Also during this day Sgt Robinson and his squad captured (23) German prisoners. While using the mine detectors along a, road, a group of Germans was sighted, and at the point of the mine detectors these wermans surrendered.

5 July 0720 Sgt Nixon and his squad left Bn area and relyeved Sgt Harris and his squad in the 325 sector. Sgt Nixon's squad continued clearing roads under heavy small arms fire the greater part of the day.

On 6 July 0730 Sgt Robinson and his squad left Bn area to relieve Sgt Nixon and his squad. This squad continued sweeping for mines under amall arm fire and occassiomal shelling.

On 7 July 0730 Sgt Breidenbaugh and hia squal laft Ba area to relieve Sgt Robm inson and his squad and continued on ame mission. At 1030 this date the Engre have been relieved fr 325 Int and returned to Bn CP.

On 3 June 1944 HiSS Co boarded ship at CARDIFF, WALES, and put out in $i$ h he harbor. On the night of 5 and 6 June 1944 Company "Bn with the Commanding Officer; It Col ${ }^{\text {Nat }}$ Palmer, took off by $C-47 s$ for the scheduled drop zones near CHRF DO PONT and ST MERE EGLISE, FRANCE.

On 6 June 1944 at 2100 the first glider echelon consisting of $B n$ Rxec; $S-2 \& S=3$, and $A D E$, plus a squad from Company "A", left Membury Field and Janded in FRAYCE at 2300. The entire glider load landed safely and dug in in the vicinity of tteedrop field.

The first troops from this unit to land in FRANCE Was Company B B $\quad$ Janding with the 508th Combat Team and the 505th Combat Team at 0208 on 6 Jind 1944 at 14 Ki ein and It Finlayson and their sticks landed on the DZ. It Connally landed Eást of DZ ard proceeded Southwest with 10 men, picking up two more of his own stick and glideryper a sonnel from the 80 th AA, Sig Co, and Div Hq. At 1500 hours on the same day an infantry officer took command of Company " $B^{\prime \prime}$, 508 th Prcht Inf, and It Connally rejoined the 3rd Platoon, Co $\mathrm{nB}^{\mathrm{B}}, 307 \mathrm{~A} / \mathrm{B}$ Engr. Bn. The 508th Combat Team attacked the bridge at IA FIERE at 1700 but were repulsed by armor. At 1800 the Germans attacked with heavy fire and tank support. 4 The 3 rd , Platoon took up defensive positions at IA FIEFR to the railroad bridge across the IEREERET RIVER one-half mile Northwest of IA FIERE. Several German counterattacks were repulsed here, the platoon holding its positions.

The first glider echelon, consisting of Exec 0ff, $5-2 \& 5-3, A 1$, , and one squad from Company "A", Ianded near BEAUVAIS, FRANCE, approximately milemorth-fortheast of ST MNRE EGLISE about 23006 June 1944 , the glider loads being pinned down by enemy fire until about 0200 hours. At thistime Major Bedel1, Capt kirkwod, and one-half of the Company "A squad moved outand contacted the 4 th Division whatider pilots, Capt Williams, and the remainlng ono-half, of Company nA" squad, moved out at 10007 June after helping recover the weapons and ovacuate the rounded fromithe of

The lst platoon was attached to the 3 rd . Bn to blow bridges and culverts South of IS PORT and LBISVIIIE; the 2nd Platoon was attached to 2nd Bn with assigned mission of securing CHEF DO PoNT. Both missions wiv were accomplished. The 325 th Combat Team contacted division elements near, ST, MgRE EGLISE about 1800 hours. The engineer company was relieved from attached to the 325th Inf Regt and bivouaced tio miles Northeast 01 CHFF DO PONT. $\}$

At 15008 June the 3rd Platoon, Co "Bn, was relleved from attached to the 508 th Combat Team and returned to battalion control. The lst Sgt of Co MBM reported tod Bn CP with the infarmation that only he and three men of the Ist and 2nd Platoons had been contacted since the jump. Capt Jedrziewski functioned as Div Engr, and Bi Commander since landing. A radio message from Major Bedell was received at 2100 at Bn CP , asking for our location, and Kajor. Bedell and party joined Co "A at 1500 . Major Bedell assumed command of the battalion. No word has been received from It Col Palmer, Bn C.O., or Capt Johnson, Co "B" C.O. It Tribe and the 2nd Platoon of Co "A" moved out with a battalion of the 325 th Inf to tape inundated road and check for mines on the attack across MERDERET RIVER one mile Fiest of IA FIEFE on the raila road causeway to AMFREVILIE, leaving battalion area at 2230.

On 9 June the seaborne elements consisting of HES CO, and Yed Det arrived at the battalion bivouac area near CHEF DU PONT. This group sailed Irom CARDIFF HALBS on 6 June at 0700 and landed at FED BEACH, FRATCE, at 16008 June, landing in barges and digging in for the night. The seaborne olements foined the battalion at $1600 \%$ ve 9 June 1944. All elements, parachute, glider, and seaborne, were present except Bn C.O., Co "B" C.O., and two platoons of Company "B".

At 00309 June It NeDermott and the Ist Platoon of Company "A" moved out with . the 325 th Inf to clear causeway across MFRDERET RIVER West of IA FIERE of enemy tanks and trucks which had been knocked out by our anti-tank fire. Major Bedell and Capt Jedrziewski joined the company at this site and crossed the causeway with the inf antry and tanks. This crossing was cotered by enemy small arms, mortar, and artillery

Company "A" (Glider) was assigned to support operations of the 325th Glider Infentry Regiment in the initial phase of its airborne operations. It landed by $k$, glider on the morning of $D$ plus 1, 7 June 1944, at approximately 0700 in the area Southeast of STE $A E R E$ EGLISE, FRANCE. Landings were made in CG-4A and HORSA gliders at scattered points within a 2 mile radius of the town. Casualties vere negligible and the company effected assembly at 0930 inith approximately $100 \%$ of its strength, including three $1 / 4$ ton trucks with trailers, all tools and explosives intact: It was attached to the 325 th Giider Infantry Regiment.

At 1200 hours, 7 June 1944, one squad of the 1st, Platoon successfully blew the bridge and culverts North of LIESVILIF, which, was threatened by counter attack of enemy forces attempting to cross the DOUVE RIVER from the South , The, 2nd platoon supported operations of the 2nd $\mathrm{Bn}, 325$ h Glider Infantry in the directiontefidy COQUERIB and CHEF DU PCNT. At 1900 hours, 7 June 1944, the company was detached from the 325 th Glider Infantry and reverted to division control and became the sole Division Fnglneer group at that time. By 0800 on 8 June 1944, the company has made a complete reconnaissance of the MERDERET RIVER valley for possible engineer crossings. During the day of $\hat{0}$, w June 1944 , it salvaged equipment supplies from wrecked gliders and from dropped parachute bundles over approximately 100 squad miles of the area then secured or partially secured by the division elements East of the RERDERET RIVER. Tw

As a result of its survey of the river it was deemed possible to effect a crossing of the 1 KRPEERET valley across the inundated area about 2,000 yards North of LA FIERE. The 2nd Platoon was attached to the lst Bn , 325 th Glider Infantry to supporty its crossing of the river and its advance toward AMFREVIIIR. It marked the submerged road across the inundated area with tracing tape, checked for mines and laid mines for three road blocks West of the 1 ERDERET RIVER, and its members fought as riflemen when an attack was made against superior German forces at AMFREVILIE. All of the se operations were conducted between 1130 hours, night of 8 June and dawn, 9 June, under constant small arms fire and heavy shelling. It continued operations with the list Bn , 0 325th Glider Infentry when it moved into defensive position in the center of the enemy territory near CAUGUIGNY, West of the MERDERET RIVER and fought off constant assaults throughout the day of 8 June.

Meanwhile on 9 June, the Ist Platoon was working with the 2nd and 3rd Bris of the 325 th Glider Infantry attacking across the bridge over the MERDERET RIVER at LAA FIERE: Since dawn of 6 June, parachute elements of the division had denied use of this crosse

the Ist Platoon proceeded to clear mines and debris from roads to every possible point where enemy fire permitted. Between 1830 and 2000 , junction was effected with the Ist Bn, 325th Glider Infantry and Company, "A , The 307 th A/B Engr. Bn reorganized and moved to a point Southeast of AMFREVILIE; on the right flank of the bridgehead. At 2000, 9 June, a heavy German counterattack breached the defensive line and Company "A" was moved into the gap and blocked it, successfully until 1500 hours on 10 June. While holding this position, the company built a rosd to the aid station in the defensive area which had been held by the isolated group of the 507 th Parachute Infantry fron 6-9 June and the wounded were evacuated.

On 11 June, reconnaissance of the DOUVE RIVER for possible crossings and bridgeheads to the South was completed. At 2215,12 June, the company moved into position to assist in crossing the DOUVE RIVER between MONTESSEY and LIESVILIE, At 0045 on 13 June, the lst Platoon of Company "A put one company of the $508 t h$ Parachute Inf andtry across the river in the dark in assault boats. This crossing was effected so, quietly and skillfully that not a shot was fired and the infantry company mas enabled to take the enemy by complete surprise. Company "A" participated in the attack on HILL 131 with one platoon, the $2 n d$ Platoon, in support of the 325 th Glider Infantry. The mission of the platoon was to clear mines and road blocks and to repair roads for our forces. During our advance the lst Platoon of Company "A was called on to, clear mines and road blocks in the advance of the 325 th and 507 th Infantries. All roads were cleared and tanks and tank-destroyer units were able to move abreast, nithithe infantry, ,

On 7 July 1944 Company "A" was relleved from duties with the iníantryielementso From that date until assembling for, departure on BED BEACH, Company MA Collected, W deactivated, and disassembled, to clear out of all, explosives, mines, boobytraps


Company "A" embarked on an LST at RED BEACH, NORMANDY, FRANCE, on 2030 auty 13" 1944 and disembarked at SOUTHHANPTON, ENGLAND, 2100 July 14, 1944. ine company then entrained for LEICESTER, ENGLAND, at 081515 July 2944 and arrived at base camp at f $1415 \mathrm{July} 15,1944$.

From 6 June 1944 to 15 July 1944
Company＂B＂，307th Airborne Engineer Battalion，was assigned for the Invasion In the following manner：lat and 2nd Platoons attached to the 508 th Prcht Inf，3rd Platoon attached to the 505th Prcht Inf．The mission of the 1st and 2nd Platoons was to blow the bridges over the DOUVE RIVER in the causeway at ETIENVIIIE while the town was under attack by the and Bn of the 508th Prcht Info The 3rd platoon was to remove any demolitions on the bridge over the MERDERET RIVER West of ST MERE EGLISE Or，in the event of its being destroyed，rebuild same after its capture by the 1 st Bn of the 505th Prcht Inf．All platoons took off from England on 5 June 1944 and jumped on the continent at 0215 on 6 June $44^{\circ}$ ．The 1st and 2nd Platoons Ianded over a wide area from ST SAUVEUR IE VICOMTE East to PICAUVILIE．The 3rd Platoon landed approximately $2-I / 2$ miles Northnest of ST MEPEECLTSE．

Scattered groups from the 1st and 2nd Platoons joined with element 8 of the 505 th， 507 th，and 508 th Prcht Infantries in their attack against the enemy．Other jolated groups began working their way back toward friendly lines，observing enemy installa－ tions，bivỏuacs，and transpostation facilities．One such group under Lt Whalen reached our lines on the 10 th of June after being behind enemy lines for 4 days 5 ．They reported numerous enemy installations and also the condition of the DOUVE RIVER fn the vicinity of ST SAUVEUR IE VICOMIE．Another group under Sgt Gabrielson reached ourfitnes on the 14th of June after being behind enemy Iines for d days．They reported enemyactivity South of the DOUVE RIVER and also the conditions of the river in the atcinity of ETIENVILIE．

The 3rd Platoon under It Klein，after landing and assembling，moved South to the vicinity of LA FIERE where they reported to the C． 0. of the 2 nd Bn 0 of the 505 th Preht Inf．They were immediately put into a defensive position at the bridge nith other \％（V） units of the 2nd Bn．After the bridge was attacked by Co A， 505 th Prcht Inf 6 the plat－ oon returned to the Bn CP．About 1500 the enemy counterattacked and the plat oon hás placed in a defensive position along tho river from the bridge to the railroad bridge． It remained in this position under fire until 2300 on 7 June．During this time it established road blocks to the rear on all roads and the railroad．It was relieved and sent back into bivouac with the 505 th Preht Inf．

On 9 June 1944 all elements were detached from the infantry and assembled as a company．At that time there were 3 officers and 40 zm．During the next feg days the company strength was brought up to 5 officers and 70 EM by the return of the men who since D－Day had been scattered over a wide area．On II June the 3rd Platoon under Lt Klein was attached to the 508th Prcht Inf for the attack in the vincity of IAvIEN VIIIE with the mission of preparing and blowing bridges in this area．They movedfinto the attack with the infantry at 2100 hours 13 June．On the 14 th of June one bridge 符斯 was prepared for blowing，one culvert and a railroad bridge were blown，all in the vicinity of BAUPTE．

From 16 June to 18 June the company was sweeping all roads behind the advancing troops from ETIENVILIE to ST SAUVEUR IR VICOMTE．It Cappa rejoined the company after 11 days behind enemy lines．It Cappa was kept in hiding，fed and given informatioid by patriotic French civilians in the town of ST SAUVEUR IE VICOMTE．On 18 June ohe platoon under Lt Klein was attached to the 50＇7th Prcht Inf，a detail under Lt Cappax to the 325 th Glider Inf，and a detail under It Whalen to the 325 th Glider，Inf．I It

Klein was to build two bridges West of CRETTEVILIS for jeep traffic immediately after the crossing was made by the 507 th Prcht Inf. It Cappa was to ferry the squad from the 325 th Glider Inf across the DOUVE RIVER to act as a diversionary action, while It Thalen was to sweep the roads South of the DOUVE RIVER immediately behind the advancing infantry. All of these missions were accomplished.

From 18 June to 3 July 1944 Company "B" was actually engaged in clearing mines, maintaining road nets, and neutralizing enemy road blocks, and establiding road blocks in front of our own units. The area was bounded by the DOUVE RIVER to the North and East, the BOIS DE ITMORS and FOREST DE WORP CASTRE to the Fest, and the PRAIRIES FARECAGEUSES to the South.

On 3 July 1944 the division made the attack on HIIJ 131 two miles North of IA HAYE DU PUITS; Company "B" was broken into small detachments to provide engineer elements with the $507 \mathrm{th}, 507 \mathrm{th}$, and 508 th Combat Teams with the primary mission of all engineer detachments to clear all rad blocks and mine fields abreast of the infantry advance. Casualties from small arms, mortar and artillery fire vere particularly heavy, but all missions were accomplished and the entire road net assigned to this company was cleared by 8 July 1944.

Specimens of new enamy mines and booby traps were collected for furtrevtraine ing until 11 July 1944, when the company moved to RED BEACH, NORMANDY, embarked on 12 July 1944 on ISTs. Company arrived at SOUTHHAMPION, ENGLAND On 13 July 1944 and moved by rail to the base camp at BURBAGE, FNGIAND, arriving there on 14 July $1945^{\circ}$

## From 6 June 1944 - To 15 July 1944

Radio and driver personnel from Hq \& Serv Co, attached to Company NA", this Bn , made glider landings in Korsa and CG*4A gliders near ST IRRE EGLSE, FRANCE, on 6 June 1944, D-Day.

The seaborne echelon of Hq \& Serv Co under Capt Decker sailed on D-Day, 6 June 1944, at 0700 hours from CARDIFF, WALES. On O D $14 \mathcal{S}^{\circ} 2$ a landing was made at $R E D$ BEACH, FRANCE, at 1600 hours. The company collected and marched two milesinland where it dug in and remgined for the night. The following day the company proceeded on foot to a new area to establish a CP mith Batfalion Headquarters at a point one mile West of ST MERE EGLISE, arriving there at 1900. At 2200 personnel began to get amminition for Company "A" which mas engaged at that time in crossing the MERDERET RIVER.

From 9 June to 10 July the company operated by sectionsgeachsection performing its normal combat duties, assisting the line companies in performing their missions. These duties comprised of water supply division engineer supplyg battainongsuply, map distribution, preparation of minemarkers, etcy transportationocaniunications; all being tied up with the activity of the battalion as a wholeg vavad

Patrols were sent out on 10 June to salvage equipment from air resupply bundles In the eicinity of the bivouac. Resuppy 0 i lost individualequipment trad being pif carried out continuously. Nines, anmunition, and bridge equipment were being prope cured and sent forward. Water points were boing established and operated. y .

On 11 June Capt Decker and three pI Tent to ST MERE BGIISE to open Vaults of the Todt Headquarters, using explosives and torches. French currency, defense maps and overlays were found in the vaults and were turned over to Division CIC personnel. A water point was set up at ST MERE EGLISE on 12 June. During the night two of the three men operating the point were rounded by shrapnel from enemy shells. Up to this point no casualties had occurred in the company.

On 15 June a second and third water points at FRAUCQUETOT and near IA BCNNEVILle were set up. During the entire operation there were from one to three, usually two, water points in operation at all times, supplying our troops, the 9th Division, and other units, the water being usually taken from streams. The wells in FRANCE did not contain sufficient water to meet our needs.

Truck drivers hauled supplies for the engineer mission on the DOUVE RIVER on 19 June.

Enemy 88 mm shellings were particularly heavy throughout the day on 25 June. The water point at FRAUCQUETOT was subjected to daily shelling. It was operated

 that ditision relieved our division.

The company moved on 11 July to the ambarkation area approximately $2-1 / 2 \mathrm{mles}$ Northwest of CRERN BRACH and bivouaced there for the night The follohing day the company loaded on an IST, bedded dom for the nlght 0 . The conpany disembarked at SOUTHHAMPTON, ENGLAND and entrained for ULLESTHORPE, ENGIAND, arriving there on the 15th of July.

During the campaign there was a total of eight casualties, of which three were the result of wounds received in action.

From 6 June 1944 to 15 July 1944
The following is a brief narrative ol medical activities during the Normandy operation. The 307 th Airborne Engineer Battailon was comitted, less Company ${ }^{n} C^{n}$, and rear echelon elements. The personnelincluded in the medical service to the o battaifon consisted of the battalion surgeon and five, en listed men as a headquarters unit, three company aid men with Company " ${ }^{\text {II }}$ (Prcht) , and tro company aid men with Company "A" (Glider). The company aid fen Nere distrlbuted one to, each platoon. Und The battailon surgeon and the five EM accompanied Headquarters and Service Company by sea. As of necessity the battalion was split up not only during the actual invasion but during the ground operations as well. Company mat went in with the 325 th Glider Infantry; Company "Bn Iess one platoon went in with the 505 th parachute Inf antry, and one plation of Company "B went in with the 507 th parachate Infantry. During the landings, parachute and g lider, the casualties were evacuated through, the nearest aid stations. The Battalion Aid station was first set up with the assembled battalion on D plus three near ST MaRB EGLISR, Each company aid man rematned ith his company all during the time we vere in the combat zone. one parachutist conpany aid man was Missing in Action from the beginning. His entire platoong with a few exceptions, was also reported kission in Action as well, consequent ly another aid man was not needed to replace hfm fmediately. One other parachutist conyany aid inan had to be evacuated due to illness after the first week; It therefore became necessar to assign a man from the aid station to replace him. - Due to the nature of our operations (Engineer) it was necessary to divide the companies into platoons and sometimes into squads in order that we might serve four infentry regiments. This in tum required additional aid men to be withdrawn from the battalion aid station to fill this need. This arrangement was not constant however because upon completion of a job or mission the various elements of the battalion were drawn back to the CP The longest any of the men were away was during the HIIL 131 engagenent two miles North of IA, \% HAYE DU PUITS, when they were away for five days. As mentioned before when they were away during these times all evacuations were accomplished through that particular infantry battalion aid station with which they were attached. On numerous occasions the aid men would help out the infantry aid men in the care of their wounded when the occasion did not take them away from their own units. Our battalion aid station remained at the battalion CP at all times. The work done here was mostly, illness, and care of minor lacerations, abrasions, and foreigh bodies and other, smaller wounds incurred while out on a mission. when the entire battalion would be out on a mission, such as the crossing of the DOUVE RIVER, the battalion surgeon accompanies the largest
 ation with the detachment, but there was a Jeep available for evacuation at all times. The equipment was transported with Hq \& Serv Co by $2-1 / 2$ ton trucks. This was entirel satisfactory and caused no inconveniences. The medical equipment, aside from individua kits, included a chest flight service, chest MD \#l, chest MD \#4, gas casualty chest, one large box plasma, six litters, a small box of miscellaneous drugs for sick call, a small blanket set, splint set, crash splint unit, and a small wall tent amount of equipment may seem like a lot at first glance but it is adequate for almost any circumstance or length of time in the combat area without worry of resupply. It is believed that the crash splint unit and the chest $\# 4$ could be dispensed with on

further operations, however, if necessary. The most valuable piece of equipment was the flight service chest. It contains just about everthing necessary for an aid station with the exception of splints. It is one plece of equipment that should never be left behind. There was no need for resupply in the detachement but had the occasion presented itself they could have been procured on a moments notice from the 307th Medical Compeny. The detachment's personnel showed gratifying results of their training in the combat zone and too minch cannot be said for their individual acts of heroism and disregard for their own personal safety. Their work was praised by all the engineer line officers and men. The battalion surgeon. recommends that during the actual landing of a parachute company a medic or at least a man well trained in first aid should be with each planeload of men. It is common knowledge that parachutists are scattered over a wide area when they jump and sometimes it is several days before some of the various planeloads report to the CP. Therefore one good man with that planeload would be worth his space. This is not only the battalion surgeon's opinion but also several of the line officers. The battalion surgeon also recommends that only that equipment that is adtrally and absolutely necessary and nothing more should be taken along. Too much equipment ia a nuisance and a waste of valuable transportation.
