- 18 Dec 44 - Left Camp Mourmelon via truck 1400 destination unknown
- 19 Dec 44 - Regt arrived at Bastogne Belgium 0130 & proceeded north & bivouaced in woods about 2000 yds NE of Bastogne 0530 moved to attack E by N of Bastogne Bizary taken enemy met just E of Bizary Defense set up position precarious
- 20 Dec 44 - We were attacked by Inf & tanks 1315 attack repulsed. Flat trajectory art fire sporadic. Situation still very precarious one Very quiet now 0710 ????
- 21 Dec 44 Shortened lines moved all of co except Det plt about 1000 yds back towards Bastogne it's colder than hell & snowing - definitely not fox hole weather
