Dear Mr. Turnbull:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. My dear Mr. Stewart:

I have your communication of 1 September 1944, with which was inclosed a letter from First Lieutenant Harry Haight of Durant, Oklahoma, requesting information relative to First Lieutenant Turner B. Turnbull, who was killed in action on 7 June 1944.

I am most sympathetic with Lieutenant Turnbull's family in their desire to obtain further particulars regarding his death and deeply regret that up to the present time no additional information pertaining to him has reached the War Department. The report submitted to this office disclosed that Lieutenant Turnbull was killed while in action against the enemy in France. However, no further particulars in this respect were given. You, no doubt, will realize that in order to accomplish the vital responsibility of transmitting casualty reports promptly, theater commanders have been obliged to limit their initial reports to the fact, place, cause and date of death since a considerable delay would occur in the rendition of these important messages if more detailed information were transmitted. You may be certain, however, that in the event more information relative to Lieutenant Turnbull is received, his family will be notified immediately.

In connection with Lieutenant Haight's inquiry regarding the remains of Lieutenant Turnbull, The Quartermaster General, this city, is charged with all matters pertaining to the remains of our deceased military personnel and your letter has, therefore, been forwarded to that official for further direct reply to you in this regard.

Your interest in securing information relative to Lieutenant Turnbull is most considerate and his family has my heartfelt sympathy in their bereavement.






